Membership Process and Probationary Status:

1. All prospective members are required to present their application and fees in person at a monthly Board of Directors meeting. Board meetings are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 PM.
2. After board approval, prospective new members must also attend a membership meeting to be voted on and sworn in. Membership meetings are usually held on the fourth Wednesday of the month at 7:30 PM with the exception of September, November and December.
3. All new members are on a two-year probationary period.
 - > During the first 24 months of membership, new members must help at two chapter events annually to be removed from probationary status.
 - > At least one of these events each year must be a conservation project.
 - > A partial list of events include kitchen help for meetings, BBQ help, assist with committee activities and projects, Adopt-A-Road, building and grounds clean ups, Christmas tree maintenance etc. Refer to the newsletter for details regarding all upcoming events.
4. All applicants and members are subject to civil and criminal background checks at any time. By signing below, you are giving your permission to request civil and criminal background checks on your behalf. Withdrawal of your permission must be in writing to the Board of Directors.

How to become a member in the Wildlife Achievement Chapter Inc. of the Izaak Walton League of America.

Complete a membership application and obtain a sponsor to sign it with you. Your sponsor must be a current member in good standing. If possible, have the sponsor attend the first meeting with you. If you do not have a sponsor, contact a Chapter member or one of the members on the Board of Directors. All board members are listed on our web site www.DamascusIWLA.org.

Bring the completed application, necessary fees and a government-provided ID to a board meeting. You must appear, in person, at a board meeting before the application will be accepted. Board meetings are held in the main clubhouse on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Please arrive by no later than 7:00 PM and speak to the membership chairman prior to the 7:30 board meeting. At the board meeting, you will meet the officers of the club and will be asked to say a few words about yourself and why you would like to join our club. This is a very informal process. At this time, the board votes on the acceptance of the new applicants.

The next step is to attend a membership meeting. Membership meetings are held in the upstairs dining hall of the main clubhouse. Here, acceptance of new members is voted on by the general membership. Once that is completed, new members are then sworn in by the membership chairperson. Membership meetings are usually held on the 4th Wednesday of the month at 7:30 PM. Most meetings (but not all) are dinner meetings and the social hour starts at 6:30 PM. Dinners are usually around \$8.00. (Wild Game dinner in January is slightly higher). Near the last quarter of the year, membership meetings are often held on odd days around Christmas and Thanksgiving. Check the newsletter, club calendar or the Web Page www.DamascusIWLA.org for the current meeting and event dates.

All new applicants will serve a two year probationary period. During each of the first two years of membership, you must help with two authorized work projects. A minimum of one each year (measured as 12 months and 24 months from the date of swearing in as a member) must be a conservation related project. Failure to complete required work projects after 24 months will prevent renewal of your membership and you could be charged an additional fee in order to renew. There are many work projects to choose. Most are in the newsletter or club calendar (see web site) and include the chairperson's phone number and E-mail address.

If you are interested in using the chapter's rifle and pistol ranges, you must first pass the Chapter and Range Officer Orientation course. The purpose of this course is to introduce you to the club rules and range safety procedures. The result is you become a Range Officer and can use the ranges on your own. Otherwise, you must use the ranges with another member that is Range Approved. Once you pass the course, you will be issued a Range Access Card. The course is normally offered on the last Sunday of the month in the upper level of the main clubhouse. Expect to be in the course for 3-4 hours. You must pre-register for the class, but there is no fee. Successful completion of the Chapter and Range Officer Orientation class is a prerequisite for taking the Shotgun Range Officer Certification course. The Shotgun Range Officer course is offered every other month. Course participation by your spouse and young children is welcome. Check the chapter's web site for details when classes are offered.

MEMBERSHIP TYPES

INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP: One adult over the age of 18 years of age, and shall be entitled to vote, hold office at the chapter, state, and national level. Each Individual Membership shall be counted as one member on the national membership rolls.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP: One or two adults over the age of 18 years of age and their natural, adopted or foster children under the age of 18 years residing together at a single residence. Family members over eighteen years of age shall be entitled to vote, hold office at the chapter, state, and national level. Each Family Membership shall be counted as two members on the national membership rolls.

STUDENT MEMBERSHIP: One adult between eighteen and twenty-one years of age, who is a full-time undergraduate student. Student members over eighteen years of age shall be entitled to vote, hold office at the chapter, state, and national level. Each Student Membership shall be counted as one member on the national membership rolls.

YOUTH MEMBERSHIP: One child under the age of eighteen years of age. Youth members shall not be entitled to vote, hold office at the chapter, state, and national level. Each Youth Membership shall be counted as one member on the national membership rolls.

When you join the chapter as an Individual Member, it is explained that your family is invited to use our facilities when accompanied by you and that spouses will be issued their own range access card if they take and pass the Chapter and Range Officer Orientation course. Members with range access cards (except spouses of individual members) will be provided two visitor badges. All family and other guests must be accompanied by the member and wear a visitor's badge at all times on the ranges.
