COMMITTEE REPORTS

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE (Jeff Deschamps)

On the March workday we re-planted the American Elms in our tree farm. The main field now has a total of 100 seedlings and there are another four planted near the storage tank. Pete Dubroff has been working on the irrigation system and we expect it to be up and running this year.

The WAC held the annual watershed clean up on Saturday, April 1 with the help of 60 volunteers from the chapter, local community, Girl Scout Troop 5354, Trout Unlimited, and the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Many thanks go to Jose and Red for feeding all of our volunteers, DNR for showing up with a truck, and Montgomery County Dept. of Solid Waste for providing a roll-off. Volunteers removed trash from the banks of the Patuxent River, trails near the river, and roads crossing the river. During the half-day event, a little more than 30 cubic yards of trash was removed from roads and parklands adjacent to the river. Organizers hope that by cleaning the roads leading to the river, we can prevent some trash from ever entering the river. Although we have seen a decrease in the amount of trash collected over the last several years, it is disheartening to still see so much litter and so much evidence of illegal dumping. Two local residents noticed the effort and made a point to thank the volunteers for their hard work. This is the third year that the Damascus clean up has been part of a larger, watershed wide event.

For April 2006, starting time is 10:00 a.m. daily and ending time is 6:30 p.m., unless some activity has preempted the range (see "Upcoming Events Affecting Range Availability" below).

Reminders:

Range Access Card and Air Travel: Your range access card is a magnetic proximity device. Most people know to keep magnets away from their credit cards and this applies to your range access card as well. Some of us keep our cards in our wallets for easy access and you can tend to forget they are there. Remember. If you travel by air you will be passing through metal detectors that utilize strong magnetic fields. One member recently discovered that his card was no longer working and his frequent air travel was probably the culprit.

Rifle and Pistol Range Rules: The rules governing Rifle and Pistol Range safety, conduct, permissible firearms, and violation policy are posted at the covered pistol range, the covered rifle range, the notice board between the pistol ranges, the notice board at the path leading to the covered rifle range, on the chapter WEB site (Damascusiwa.org)
