WHATS NEW?

On March 23, 1966 at the regular membership meeting, Charles Wiles submitted a proposed addition to the Chapter's By-Laws, which will be under Article I, titled Section 10, "Life Membership". In compliance with Article XV, Section 1, this proposed addition is submitted to the membership herewith. This proposal will be voted on at the next meeting, April 27, 1966.

AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS LIFE MEMBERSHIP

10. A chapter life membership is available for members in the Wildlife Achievement Chapter. The dues shall be fixed by the Board of Directors and approved by the membership. Life membership in the chapter will maintain the member in the chapter and the state for his lifetime. In order to maintain a chapter life membership, the member must continue his membership in the national organization with annual remittance of national dues unless he is also a national life member, in which case he will not need to pay additional dues to national. Life membership in both the national organization and the local chapter exempts the member from dues for his lifetime.

With your shells-\$1.25 a round, club reloads(plastic)-\$2.50 a round, New Plastic Shells, \$3.50 a round.
