Now Hear This: Enclosed with this bulletin you will find a self addressed post card which we are using as an informational source. It is requested that each member fill the card out completely and return as soon as possible so that the information thereon may be properly evaluated. Please take the time right now to fill this out so that your club may be what you want it to be during the coming years. An explanation of the card is as follows:

Several of the members have indicated a desire to have a swimming pool at the new grounds. It is the intention of the Board of Directors to attempt to ascertain the entire membership's feelings on this subject, therefore the post card. A study was conducted and it was found that the minimum amount to establish a decent swimming pool would require a \$250.00 membership fee (Payable one time only and repurchased by the club if member left the area), and \$40.00 a year dues for the entire family. Membership would be limited to 400 families in this club as it is in most good community pools. Should the members desire a better pool and better facilities, naturally membership and annual dues would have to be higher, therefore the choice of fees to members. To become a member of this pool one would have to first be a member of the Izaak Walton Chapter.

The pool would be professionally managed and open seven days per week just as any other community pool. Guests would be welcome at a fee of \$1.00 per person, per day, Monday thru Friday, and \$2.00 on Saturday, Sunday and holidays. There would be a snack bar, dressing and locker rooms, as well as our regular clubhouse. The pool would be an Olympic style

pool with diving area, swimming area, and small pool for the "Tykes". In considering this matter it is felt that possibly a pool of this nature might develop our club into a closer family organization and would allow for the family's amusement as well as the members.

The questions relating to club interest are important so that we may develop those areas in conjunction with the members' desires. Please indicate your preference in order by #1, #2, etc.
