This unique match on October 21st involves rifle and shotgun scores, the use of silhouette targets, and shooting trap and skeet with same shotgun barrel. Rifles must be a minimum .243 caliber, weigh no more than 10 lbs., and if scoped, no more than 6X power. Shotguns may be of any gauge, but the same barrel must be used for both skeet and trap, and guns with compensators cannot be adjusted once the shooting begins. Shot cannot be larger than 7½ and no magnums. Registration is just \$7.00 to cover targets and prizes with shooting beginning promptly at 10 a.m. Bring your own ammo, your hunting buddies (members and non-members), and join a fun day.
