This will be a wide open match with any pistol cartridge allowed, firearm weight not to exceed 4 1bs with iron or open sights only. We'll shoot 40 rounds at the standard hunter pistol metallic targets; chicken at 25 yds, pig at 50 yds, turkey at 75 yds and ram at 100 yds. HAVE YOU OBSERVED GAME OR FISHING VIOLATORS, HIGHWAY LITTERING or other abuses of our natural resources, and didn't know what to do about it? REPORT has the answer. REPORT is a program sponsored by the Maryland Natural Resources Police that provides citizens a way of reporting abusers. Our IWLA supports this program. When you spot an abuser, fill out a Report Card (blanks available at our clubhouse or the Maryland offices of Natural Resources Police in Annapolis and in the Regional Offices) and mail it to Natural Resources Police, Tawes State Office Building, Annapolis, MD 21401. The police will follow-up on the abusers. You may also call the Annapolis Headquarters, 24 hours a day at 267-7740, to report abusers.
