*METALLIC SILHOUETTE PISTOL SHOOT: Will be held Sunday Sept 27 at 1 PM. Any center fire handgun regardless of weight or caliber is eligible; however, guns must have iron sights only. No gun or barrel changes are permitted once shooting starts. The matchconsists of 20 rounds of ammo fired at standard hunter pistol metallic targets—chickens at 25 yards, pigs at 50 yards, turkeys at 75 yards, and rams at 100 yards. *CENTERFIRE HANDGUN SHOOT: Sunday Oct 4 at 1 \overline{PM} (NEW DATE). Shooting will be slow, timed rate and rapid fire at ranges of 25 and 50 yards. Any centerfire handgun with iron sights is eligible. For details, call Bernie Beckman (384-6112) or Ari Sapir (384-1430).

*HUNTERS (Rifle and Shotgun) CHALLENGE MATCH: Sunday Oct 18 at 1 PM. Course consists of 20 rounds (rifle) at cardboard silhouettes from various hunting positions. Rifle minimum caliber=.250, maximum weight= $10\frac{1}{2}$ pounds, scope maximum magnification=9X. Also 50 rounds (shotgun) at trap and skeet targets. Any gauge shotgun may be used but once shooting starts, the same gun and barrel must be used for both trap and skeet. For details, call Smith DeForce (460-8762).
