ATTENTION GUN OWNERS AND DEFENDERS OF CITIZENS RIGHTS - The Montgomery County Ammunition Bill that passed by a split Council vote, making it necessary to register all firearms using pistol caliber ammo, was declared INVALID on October 20 by a Court as a result of a suit filed by MCCJFL Legal Action Fund. However, the County Council, again by a split vote, is appealing to the highest Maryland Court to reinstate the law. Again, gun owners must go to court to defend their rights to purchase ammo without registration laws. The MCCJFL Legal Action Funds will need contributions to help defray the court costs and put the Ammunition Bill to rest forever.
