GOVERNOR WILLIAM DONALD SCHAEFER has established April 29 as ADOPT A DUMP DAY. Our Wildlife Achievement Chapter, under the able Chairmanship of Dr. Charlie Wiles, is sponsoring and coordinating the Patuxent River cleanup on April 29, as part of the Governor's Chesapeake Bay Cleanup Program to clean up all the trash deposits near our streams. We will need at least 35 Members to join with 75 Boy Scouts, 10 members of local Trout Unlimited chapters, representatives from Howard and Montgomery County governments, and representatives of the Maryland Department of Parks. Governor Schaefer will visit the site and join with us in publicizing the cleanup program. Meet with us between 8:30 and 9:00 a.m. at the intersection of Howard Chapel Road and Jennings Chapel Road. To reach this point, proceed as follows: From the Damascus area, take Rt. 108 south to Rt. 650, then Rt.650 to Howard Chapel Rd., (on left). From Rockville/ Silver Spring / Gaithersburg/Wheaton, take Rt. 97 north through Olney to Jennings Chapel Rd. (just north of the Patuxent River), or Rt.650 (New Hampshire Ave.) north from Silver Spring/ Wheaton to Howard Chapel Rd., on right. Lunch will be provided for all participants.
