



- THE ANNUAL WILD GAME DINNER AND AUCTION was enjoyed by at least 207 (paid) members and guests. The excellent dinner and auction netted approximately \$3,195.00 for the Chapter. Planning and execution of this affair entails a great deal of effort, usually on the part of a few, but extra special thanks are due Paul Jackson and his loyal helpers in the kitchen and elsewhere. This was an outstanding evening for all.

It has become the policy of the Wildlife Achievement Chapternot to waste any food. As in the Sermon on the Mount, when all the leftovers and debris were collected and delivered to the Rockville United Church, enough soup stock was prepared by the church people to supply the Zaccheus (Soup) Kitchen in the District with soup for at least four Saturdays; the Kitchen feeds about 500 people each Saturday.

- THE RECYCLING SHED IS EMPTY! Ready for more glass, aluminum and newspaper. If you can take your papers to the nearest County recycling dumpster, please do so, unless it is picked up at your curbside. As a last resort, bring it to the shed on the Chapter grounds. Efforts are being made to develop more markets for recycled newsprint. Experiments at Penn State University show that shredded newsprint makes safe and practical bedding in dairy barns, as one use.
- THE ANNUAL DUMP CLEANUP DAY, Saturday, April21, is nearing. Several Scout troops have volunteered to assist, as have other groups. If enough volunteers show up, more than one site might be cleared. This will be an all-day effort; food will (hopefully) be provided. More details in the March News Letter.
