CANVAS BAGS are needed, to be filled with sand, for use on the firing ranges. Anyone having some, please bring them in; John Perry needs them.



PERMISSION WAS GRANTED at the December Board Meeting to hold a series of five informal competition rifle and pistol matches for Chapter Members during 1994. THE FIRST of the several shooting events will be held on Saturday, February 12. This will be a rifle match using military rifles such as the 45-70 Trapdoor, .30-.40 Krag, Mausers, Enfields, Springfields, SKS's, AR 15's or whatever else you might have. The only limitation is the rifle must have the original issue iron sights on it. The course of fire will be 10 rounds at 50 yards in the standing position and 10 rounds at 100 yards in your choice of sitting or kneeling position. There will be a 20 minute firing period at each distance which will include both 5 sighter shots and the 10 rounds for score.

Registration for the first relay will begin at 9:30 a.m. and registration for the last relay will close at 1:30 p.m. Participants will be registered and will shoot as they arrive during the day. There will be a \$5.00 registration fee. Shooters should bring spotting scopes and eye and ear protection. Pieces of carpet will be available to use as shooting mats. Participants will be expected to assist with spotting of sighting shots, scoring and hanging of targets during the course of the match.

Firing will be under the supervision of a range officer and all range safety rules will be followed including the use of "open bolt" safety flags in rifle breeches when guns are not being fired.

A match orientation session will be held on Wednesday evening, February 2nd at 7:30 p.m. in the IWLA Chapter House for those wishing to attend. The purpose of this informal meeting will be to give some basic instruction in firing in the standing, kneeling and sitting positions using the military sling. Techniques of sighting will also be demonstrated. Bring your military rifle and sling (NO AMMO) so others can see what you will be shooting at the match.

We hope the weather cooperates for this February 12 match! It might be cold and muddy ---dress accordingly. If the range road is soft, we will have to park at the club house and "march down" to the range. Plan to participate in this first of several chapter shooting events for 1994.
