1-2-3-TOURNAMENT PRIZES

Fees Set

Prizes for the June "1-2-3" Shotgun Tournament may range up to cases (**worth over \$50**) of shotgun shells of choice in the winner's gauges (Remington, Winchester, Federal), partial cases for second and third place scorers. Even better, under the **LEWIS scoring system**, by cutting the total number of shooters in each event into "**flights**" as in golf, there can be multiple first, second and third place winners in each event - Skeet, 5-Stand and Trap. The final number of winners is determined by the number of competitors in each event. So, the more shooters, the more prizes... In addition, **Special Awards will be given to the three high overall shooters for the three-event combined competition.**

Shooting **must** take place during range hours weekends or Wednesday nights during the first three weeks of June and **must** be certified when they are shot by a designated referee. Tournament Judges will be drawn from our most experienced tournament veterans to settle technical matters.

In the "1-2-3" format, entrants may shoot all or any of the three events (three rounds of skeet, two of 5-Stand, one of trap) with their own regular guns and ammunition (minimum 12-gauge guns and up to 3-dram loads).

Members and personal friends (*shooting together*) may enter. Entree forms must be received by Range Officers. Forms will be in the June NewsLetter or at the Club in May. Further details will be posted in the Range House and outlines in the June NewsLetter.

The **ComboEntree Fee is \$25** for all three events (six rounds), or **\$15 for skeet only, \$10 for 5-Stand only, \$5 for Trap only.**

Our Second speaker was Hedrick Belin, the National IWLA Conversation Associate. 1-2-3 TOURNAMENT, NEW SKEET TRAPS, 5-STAND UPGRADES MARK WAC SHOTGUN PROGRAM PROGRESS, RAHN REPORTS

(Editor's Note: With our 1-2-3 Shotgun Tournament ready to start in a few days (see OFFICIAL ENTRY Form, page opposite), we thought it might be a good time to talk to Bill Rahn, Chairman of our Shotgun Programs, about what's new and what's ahead.)

Editor: Bill, how long have you been into shotgun sports?
Rahn: Since I was about 12 years old...but the date is classified!
Editor: I understand! So, when did you start with IWLA?
Rahn: Let's see, I joined IWLA in 1965 at the original location of this Chapter, over on Briggs Chaney Road in Fairland, Maryland. I worked on the move to Damascus by, among other things, helping plant some of the white pines you can still see. Later, I was Membership Secretary for two or three years until 1980.
Editor: When did you get so deeply into the club's shotgun operations?
Rahn: As I recall - in approximately 1982 - I was one of the group that began to put in the skeet and trap facilities. It took us until 1985 to get where we are now.

CURRENT STATUS

Editor: I see in the minutes that the Board appointed you Chairman of the shotgun operations in 1993, right?
Rahn: Yes, at the same time they appointed Chuck Crooks manager of the financial aspects of our shotgun activities.
Editor: From your point of view, Bill, as the shotgun chief, where are we now?
Rahn: I can't point to anything better than the June 1-2-3 Tournament to illustrate how far we have come in recent years, and where we can go. Because of recent improvements, we can have an interesting and novel tournament format that uses all our facilities and offers many valuable prizes. Any shooter can win, no matter what his experience. I think it is just right now for our shooters.
Editor: Why is that?
Rahn: Basically, because it's a good deal! We've priced to break even (we hope!), and do something so more members will have more fun. For the low \$25 entry fee, the shooters get cracks at multiple prizes - up to cases of shells in all three of our games - skeet, trap and 5-Stand - 10 boxes in a case worth over \$50! We eased some of the stricter "Official Rules" to let more shooters into the game by, for one example, permitting entrants to use any gun up to 12-gauge, and any shells up to 1-1/8 ounce of 7 1/2 shot. Members can enter and win in each of the three events, too, but only their best scores count for the three top High Overall prizes. And, because some of us do have other things to do some Wednesday nights and weekends, we've spaced the tournament over the first three weeks of June so that any of us can get in.

WIDE OPEN TOURNAMENT

Editor: What's different about the 1-2-3 Tournament?
Rahn: This: The 1-2-3 scheme opens all our games to everybody - it's that easy. We are using the Lewis System of scoring to really level the fields. No matter what scores you can shoot, you've got a chance to win the same prizes as our low-handicap hot shots under the Lewis prize distribution method.
Editor: See box below for details.)
Editor: But, why now?
Rahn: We have just completed the critical first stage of upgrading. We have the 5-Stand Sporting Clays field up and running as it should, and Jim Malone, has just finished reprogramming the launch sequences to be more hittable by beginners and novices. We have rebuilt the trap machine on Field Two so it works all the time; With John Corbin's expertise we have installed new Swedish machines in the high and low houses on Field Three. They hold 400 birds, are state-of-the-art systems, and extremely accurate and rugged. They are so smooth and quiet that those of us who "swing on the sound" of our ratty old traps, better learn to open our eyes! Back to real world skeet!
Editor: All this in the last two years?
Rahn: Pretty much.... Over the last couple of years we were able to design and build the 5-Stand from scratch - ourselves! Members like Kevin O'Neil, Jim Malone, Roy Geisler, Mike Merollini, Alan Newcomer and many others sawed a

lot of board and hit a lot of nails! Ed Bennett with Bill Wright and several others helped rewire our power service to the fields and installed a new panel board.

BETTER BUSINESS

Editor: How's Range business? Is it getting harder to get shooting supplies?
Rahn: Yes, it is, in today's atmosphere, and prices show it. But our range business is growing. There are more new shooters and our current members are shooting more. Thanks to Chuck Crook's tight fists, we've sharpened up the way we are doing business with our suppliers of ammunition and reloading supplies. We're trying to hold the line, but if supplies get scarcer, we'll just have to bite the bullet! Ed Bennett's Saturday night Turkey Shoots brings in a very good income for the Club, week in and week out, during the good season of the year. We draw turkey shooters from all over this area now, many repeaters. I'm only surprised more members don't try to put some of this good meat on their tables.

THIS FALL - THE TEAM CHALLENGE

Editor: So, what's next?
Rahn: This Fall, because of our improvements, we have been asked to host a Sportmen's Team Challenge shooting competition. This is a really terrific spectator event if you want to see some very fancy shooting. Three-man teams from all over the East Coast will come here early in the Fall to compete in rapid fire events in pistol, rifle and shotgun. Our Rifle and Pistol ranges will be set up for timed fire in those events, and our 5-Stand field will be used for the shotgun part. There, each three-man team, firing together from Stands two, three and four, will have one minute to shoot up to 75 shots at 50 birds, thrown rapidly and continuously - at random! This I want to see! And the way our fields and ranges are laid out, this will be about the best spectator shooting competition you could ask for. The Challenge organization supplies all the equipment we don't already have, like dropping pistol targets, and so forth, and we will get the income from any concessions we set up. I'll have all the details for The NEWSLETTER in a month.

DOWN THE ROAD

Editor: And, we'll certainly print thatSo, Bill, what are you thinking about - way down the road?
Rahn: Eventually, we can look forward to replacing the rest of the 23-year old skeet machines before they disintegrate. And, acknowledging the irresistible wave of the future in shotgun sports, we'd better begin a long look at how we can put in a true Sporting Clays walk-through course.
 President Mac McCollum and the Board of Directors have been great supporters of our progress. Chuck Crooks and I, all the volunteers who worked so hard getting our act together, all the dependable Range Officers who carry the load on shooting days, and the increasing number of our members who use the shooting facilities, really appreciate what we been enabled to do so far.
Editor: Bill, thanks for sitting still for me and thanks for a great job.

LEWIS SCORING - HOW IT WORKS

At end of tournament, in each event, scores of shooters are arranged from high to low. Depending on number of shooters, each list is cut into several classes, with, for example, ten consecutive scores in each class. Prizes are awarded to the first three shooters in each cut. Ties at the cut move up; ties just below the cut are combined, and the prizes for that class are pooled and divided equally among the tied shooters. High Overall shooters win based on their combined three-event totals, independent of LEWIS.
