# SILVER BULLETS CRUSH COMPETITION WILDLIFE WILDONES 14th OVERALL

#### The Gathering

Twenty shooting teams gathered at the IWLA Wildlife Achievement Chapter in Damascus, MD on Saturday, Sept 30 and Sunday, Oct 1 to participate in the Chevy Truck Sportsman Team Challenge. event, sponsored by Chevy Trucks, is an 8 year old shooting competition held through the country regionally culminating in · the National Championships in Ft. Lauderdale, FL. Three person teams of men, women, juniors or combinations shot a total of six matches - three in shotgun sporting clays and one each of precision rifle, pistol and combo rifle/pistol.

Approximately 300 guests, volunteers and participants gathered for two days to watch teams from the mid-Atlantic area (Maryland, New York,

Pennsylvania, Virginia, Ohio and Delaware) compete in shotgun, rifle and pistol events. Team skills varied considerably from experienced, proven competitive shooters to teams put together at the last minute. Experienced teams showed their merit with proven shooting techniques and defined methodologies for shooting and reloading.


## The Winning Teams

When the smoke had cleared and all scores were tallied the Berlin, PA team, Silver Bullets (John Clites, Carl Bernosky and Tom Langley) was declared "Overall Winners" having scored 498 out of a possible 600 and was awarded the top cash prize of \$600. Team Challenger from Topton, PA finished Second Overall shooting 469 (\$405 cash prize) and No Second

Best from Lockport, NY, being true to their name, finished Third Overall scoring 444 (\$225 cash prize). Hollidaysburg Sportsmen from Hollidaysburg, PA won Fourth Overall scoring 438 (\$150 cash), Hollidaysburg TOO, from guess where, won Fifth Overall scoring 417 (\$105 cash), and Moores Shooters from Pasadena/Glen Burnie, MD won Sixth Overall scoring 404 (\$75 cash). The only all-female Annie Oakley team, finished Twentieth.

Other Event winners included The Silver Bullets who won both the Top Rifle event (100 out of 100) and Overall Shotgun shooting 85%. High Pistol was won by Team Challenger

#### Side Events

In addition to the six scheduled events, several "side events" proved exciting. Tom Langley won the Solo Pistol Challenge, an abbreviated version of the three man pistol shoot (a timed event) running between two tables while downing all 29 targets in 66 seconds. Eddie Esworthy, an Olympic shooter, was second hitting all targets in 70 seconds. Gary Montgomery, Match Director, downed all targets in 91 seconds.

Eric Over of Sometimes Shooters won the Shooters Auction for the Ruger stainless 1022 Rifle. The Annie Oakleys proved more successful at the raffles with two members winning the Colt 22 Pistol and SKB Model 1900 12 guage semi-automatic.

# **IWLA Chapter Action**

Of local interest, the Wildlife Wildones (Chuck Crooks, Ed Bennett and Archie Cheng) from the Wildlife Achievement Chapter finished 14th Overall (320) and Team Monacy (Gary Montgomery, Greg Talamini and Rick Fiore) representing the Rockville IWLA Chapter finished 9th Overall (371). These were the only IWLA sponsored teams participating. Rick Fiore recently joined the Wildlife Chapter.

#### Real Success

Gary Montgomery, the event organizer, and Bill Kelly, event coordinator, declared the event a major success. Gary stated that "over \$5000 in cash, awards and prizes were awarded. Since this was the first time we've held this event locally, we wanted to be sure everyone had a good time and that teams were well rewarded. Shooting participation would have been greater but five teams canceled out during the last week. The Wildlife Achievement

Chapter has excellent facilities for hosting this event and the volunteers did a tremendous job preparing the facilities and coordinating the event. Everyone enjoyed themselves and expressed strong interest in returning next year for renewed competition." Gary anticipates building the event to 40 teams. "We hope the Wildlife Achievement Chapter will continue to hold this event each year."

Bill Kelly, event coordinator, waxed enthusiastically about the "smooth flow" and reiterated Gary's comments regarding the overall success. "The Wildlife Achievement Chapter hosted this event and provided 40 volunteers to prepare food, paint targets, run raffles, load and operate the trap machines, score, administer and coordinate the activities." "We were not without our share of mishaps, especially during setup on Friday when several trap machines broke down. Chuck Crooks and Ed Bennett provided herculean efforts to get the machines working so the shotgun events could go on as scheduled. We had two shooters in wheelchairs, so we really "scurried" about to get them set up on the various ranges. They were gracious towards our inadequate "handicap shooting facilities" and even offered to assist the Chapter in making the facilities more user friendly for handicapped persons. Our grant from DNA will go a long way toward eliminating this problem in the future. Our volunteers performed admirably and made everyone feel Although things went smoothly, we learned a lot and I'm sure we can make major improvements in the years to come."

#### The Feast

On Saturday evening after the days completion, 80 participants and volunteers enjoyed a barbecue provided by the Wildlife Chapter and prepared by the able crew of "chief cook" Paul Jackson and staff. Every one attending seemed to enjoy the food, setting, and comradeship shooting stories were in abundance.
