

Changing the date for selecting delegates to the IWLA National Convention.

Increasing the number of Standing Committees.

Reducing the time allowed for depositing Chapter funds.

Changing the order of business during Chapter meetings.

# Rifle and Pistol Range Report

**INFORMATION:** For more information about any of the rifle/pistol range activities mentioned in this article, contact **Ray Shaver** by e-mail at **MRShaver@aol.com** or telephone at (301) 926-0465.

SHOOTING HOURS: Authorized Rifle/Pistol Range shooting hours are posted on the range sign-in box. For March 2000, starting time is 10:00 AM daily and ending time is 6:00 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. Because sunset changes slightly each day, the sign is periodically updated. Please help us avoid offending our neighbors by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

PROJECT MANAGER NEEDED: We need someone to take overall responsibility for coordinating efforts on a very important project: the improvement of sound barriers at the Rifle and Pistol Ranges. We have some ideas about where we want to start, but are open to suggestions from a member with some experience in such projects, and both the willingness and ability to get something done in a reasonable time frame. MARCH CLEANUP: Maintenance of the rifle and pistol ranges is scheduled from 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM on Sunday, March 26. Please report to the green equipment shed,

below the chapter house, to sign in and get a work assignment. Ray Shaver will be coordinating the cleanup activities. If you can't make it on Sunday, consider helping out with the cleanup at the end of the cowboy action shoot around 3:00 PM on Saturday, March 25.

STEEL TARGETS: Our range rules specify that only "range-approved metal targets" are permitted on the Chapter rifle and pistol ranges. The process to get a metal target "range-approved" was purposely left ambiguous, when metal targets were introduced into the rules in 1996. Based on experience, we automatically permit all commercially made falling or spinning targets, but require inspection for all others. The most important part of the process is to communicate the rules on target placement and the type of ammunition to be used. Specifically, steel targets must be placed at least 25 yards from the firing line, directly in front of the earth bank backstop. Furthermore, only unjacketed lead bullets are permitted for use on steel targets. We are well aware that cowboy action shoots and other competitive shooting activities involve placing the steel targets closer than 25 yards, but those are special events which are strictly supervised by safety officials. For everyday shooting on WACC ranges, shooters must comply with the 25 yard minimum distance and lead bullet requirement. The next version of our range rules will reflect the practices described above. A final warning: The risk of splatter and ricochets increases significantly as steel targets are damaged with heavy use. Please replace your steel targets when they become noticeably dimpled and pockmarked.

WORKERS NEEDED: Ray Shaver needs three to five volunteers, who are not cowboy action shooters, to assist with the relocation of targets and props and with range cleanups associated with the "Thunder Valley Days" cowboy action shoot during the last week in April. #### Air Pistol Match

## **Bluebird Trail Update**

Phil and Martha Dean checked out nesting activity along the Bluebird Trail established on our property. One of our bluebird houses had five bluebird eggs in it, but the eggs did not incubate. Tree swallows occupy three of our houses. Five other bluebird houses have evidence of bluebird nests, but English sparrows now occupy those houses. Two boxes show no nesting activity. In short, we have had great success in attracting birds, but not exactly the ones we wanted!

## Montgomery County Bird Breeding Atlas

The Montgomery County Department of Environmental Protection is beginning a five year study of bird breeding within the county. The project will begin this summer. The final product will be a web page with species information, habitat requirements, bird distribution within the county, population, history, and nesting habits. Volunteers are needed for field work and data gathering, entry, and analysis. ## Howard County 2000 General Plan

The Howard County Department of Planning and Zoning has invited our Chapter to participate in reviewing and providing input on proposed policies and actions for the 2000 General Plan. The General Plan serves as the foundation for development and preservation in Howard County for the next ten years. Typically, it includes recommendations for rezoning, changing subdivision and development regulations, and maintaining a good quality of life in the face of dwindling open spaces. We were invited to participate because of our efforts to protect and improve the Patuxent River and Triadelphia Reservoir.

Two of our members, Bill Kelly and Meo Curtis, have attended two meetings for the General Plan. To date, they have participated in discussions of enforcement of environmental regulations, making environmental ordinances more effective, down-zoning the area near Triadelphia Reservoir, watershed management, and establishment of a Department of Environmental Protection. ### Why the NRA?
