





Rifle and Pistol Range Report

INFORMATION: For more information about any of the rifle/pistol range activities mentioned in this article, contact **Ray Shaver** by e-mail at MRShaver@aol.com or telephone at (301) 926-0465.

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours for May 2000, are from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM daily, unless some activity has preempted the range. Because sunset changes slightly each day, the sign is periodically updated. Please help us to be a good neighbor by not shooting before the posted starting time or after the posted ending time.

MAY CLEANUP: Maintenance of the rifle and pistol ranges is scheduled from 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM on Sunday, May 21. Please report to the green equipment shed, below the chapter house, to sign in and get a work assignment. Ray Shaver will coordinate cleanup activities.

MILITARY RIFLE SHOOTS: Members who missed the annual military rifle fun shoot on March 18 have asked that we schedule next year's event on a Sunday, when more people are off work. Since it was so lightly attended this year, we will try to comply with that request. Military rifle enthusiasts should note that the Seneca Valley high-power matches, held monthly during the spring and summer, are a lot of fun. If you get a chance, participate in one, or at least stop by and see how they are run.

Rifle Range Restoration

A Montgomery County zoning inspector visited our facility on April 10, 2000 in response to complaints from our neighbors about shooting noise. The inspector identified several zoning violations, the most serious of which was the lack of a wood chip sound barrier behind the rifle range. Such a barrier was required and existed at one time but over the years it had deteriorated to the point that few members even knew it once existed. On Thursday, April 19, 2000, Montgomery County ordered that the rifle range be closed. Within an hour, our membership came together to restore the sound barrier. Bob Mabie immediately arranged for three truckloads of wood chips to be delivered to the range. Mac McCollum designed a wire mesh enclosure to support the wood chips and the enclosure was built by Mac, Chuck Crooks, Bill Gazdik, Ray Halperin, Terry McCoy, Steve Peck, Richard Phelan, John St. Clair, and Ray Shaver on Friday. April 20. Then, on Saturday, April 22, a crowd of members and nonmembers arrived to place the wood chips behind the enclosure. Included were: Ken Bell, Wayne Berkebile, Ed Burrows, Jay Clark, Chuck

The zoning inspector authorized the rifle range to be reopened on Monday afternoon, April 22. So, in five days we were able to resume our riflery activities.

Archery Report

Thanks to Rudy and Danny Mattern and Jake Hamilton, numerous Boy Scouts were able to earn a merit badge in archery. The archery lessons were given at our facility during April 2000. Rudy Mattern is the former owner of Angler and Archer and a member of the Bethesda-Chevy Chase IWLA

Please remember, no broadheads may be shot into club targets. We will be making an area where they can be used, but for now you must use your own targets if you want to use broadheads.
