### Skeet and Trap Report

Two clinics will be offered on Saturday, July 8, 2000. First, a beginner's skeet clinic will run from 9:00 AM until noon for persons new to skeet shooting. Kids, accompanied by an adult, are welcome. The clinic will begin with an hour of orientation followed by two hours of on-field instruction. Class size is limited to ten students. There is a charge for the course. Participants will pay club rates for targets and they must provide their own shells.

The second clinic will begin at 12:30 PM. This class is for more advanced skeet shooters who want to improve their scores at certain stations. All instruction will take place on Field Four on a drop-in basis.

For June 2000, starting time is 10:00 AM daily and ending time is 8:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. Because sunset changes slightly each day, the sign is periodically updated. Please help us to be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

JUNE CLEANUP: Maintenance of the rifle and pistol ranges is scheduled from 10:00 AM until 1 PM on Sunday, June 25. Please report to the green equipment shed, below the chapter house, to sign in and get a work assignment. Ray Shaver will be coordinating the cleanup activities.

#### RIFLE RANGE SOUND BARRIER:

When Montgomery County authorized the reopening of our rifle range on April 24, it was under the condition that we complete the restoration of the sound barrier by reconstructing the shed roof that protects its wood chips from the weather, and finish chinking between logs in the vertical log walls which comprise part of the barrier. Those tasks were completed in several work sessions during April and May. Again, we are seeking volunteers to serve as official range safety officers and oversee range activities during the busiest periods of range activity, primarily weekend afternoons. ## **Cowboy Shoots**

Cowboy Shoots will continue on the fourth Saturday of the month through November, 2000. Set-up is the Friday before the shoot, so ranges are closed from approximately 1:00 PM on Friday until approximately 3:30 PM on Saturday.
