



Rifle and Pistol Range Report

INFORMATION: For more information about any of the rifle/pistol range activities mentioned in this article, contact **Ray Shaver** by e-mail at **MRShaver@aol.com** or telephone at (301) 926-0465.

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For April 2001, starting time is 10:00 AM daily and ending time is 7:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. Because sunset changes slightly each day, the sign is periodically updated. Please help us be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

RIFLE TARGET NUMBERS: Our facilities are maintained and developed by volunteers. If something bugs you, go ahead and do something about it. Ray Halperin, known to many of us as the principal range officer for our deer hunter qualification events, is a good example. The target numbers recently installed on the rifle range are the results of his initiative. His explanation of their purpose appears below:

"There are 10 shooting benches on the rifle range. There are fourteen target frames on the one hundred yard line of the rifle range. The difference between the number of shooting benches and the number of target frames causes a random method of selecting upon which target frame a member mounts his target(s). This confusion causes cross firing on the rifle range. Cross firing is unsafe and must be eliminated.

To eliminate the problem, a number sign has been placed under each of the ten center target frames on the one hundred yard line of the rifle range. Each target frame number corresponds to the number which appears on the rear left-hand side of each shooting bench. Members shooting from a bench or in

the immediate vicinity of a bench should mount their target(s) on the target frame that bears the same number as the bench they are using. By shooting at the proper target, members will avoid firing on another member's target(s) and/or cross firing on the range. Hopefully, the frequently asked question of "what target are you on?" will be eliminated."

FYI, the two extra targets on each side of the one hundred yard line are used during events where shooters fire from positions forward of the shooting benches. This permits a fourteen shooter relay.

SECURITY GATE: Occasionally our security gate may fail to close after someone has passed through it. If you encounter an open gate, please go through the process of presenting your proximity card to the reader anyway so it may record information about your entry. Never go to the ranges through an open gate without your proximity card, since you may find the gate closed when you attempt to leave!

PLYWOOD NEEDED: Our supply of plywood target backers is about gone. We don't want to buy new plywood just to shoot it up. Your donations of plywood capable of being cut into 2'x2' pistol backers or 2'x4' rifle backers will be appreciated. Drop donations by the door to the equipment shed, and include your name so we'll know who to thank.

.22 FUN SHOOT: Families are encouraged to attend our .22 Sporter Fun Shoot from 10:00 AM until early afternoon on Saturday, May 12. There is no charge and no chance of embarrassment for participants in this informal, noncompetitive event. Because it is a special event, you and the kids will get a chance to shoot at our steel knockdown targets and silhouettes, along with novelty targets, like balloons and earth-bound clay pigeons. Bring a .22 rimfire rifle and lots of inexpensive .22 ammunition plus eye and ear protection. New members can help satisfy their work requirement by coming early to help set things up, or lending a hand in putting away things at the end.

NEW RANGE RULES: On April 4, 2001, our Board of Directors approved a revised version of the Rifle/Pistol Range Rules & Regulations. A copy of the new rules is already posted on our web site,

under the section entitled "Range Rules." We plan to also distribute copies to each member as an insert to the May/June newsletter. Thanks to the many members who assisted in the rules revision process over the past year.

APRIL RANGE MAINTENANCE:

Range and site maintenance will be done from 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM on Sunday, April 29. Please report to the green equipment shed for an assignment. Ray Shaver will be coordinating maintenance of the rifle and pistol ranges.

The match can be fired on either Monday, April 23, or Monday, April 30, 2001 between 5:00 PM and 9:00 PM. All targets must be fired on the same day.
