Rifle and Pistol Range Report

INFORMATION: For more information about any of the rifle/pistol range activities mentioned in this article, contact **Ray Shaver** by e-mail at MRShaver@aol.com or telephone at (301) 926-0465.

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For July 2001, starting time is 10:00 AM and ending time is 8:00 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. This is the latest ending time permitted by WAC policy, and will remain in place until late August. Please help us to be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

RANGE ENTRY REMINDER: The range road entry gate does not start working until thirty minutes before the start of shooting hours. That means you can never enter before 9:30 AM unless you are participating in a special event, like cowboy action shoots,

where the gate is locked open manually to permit the participants to gather at the range before the start of shooting. If the gate fails to open, check the time, and remember that our computer and your watch may not be in precise synchronization.

BOWLING PIN SHOOT: A bowling pin fun shoot will be held on the uncovered pistol range following the Cowboy Action Shoot, at around 4:00 PM, on **Saturday, July 28**. Please **do not** go directly to the range. Bowling pin shooters will meet at the Chapter house for registration and will go to the range after all cowboy action shooters have left. Thunder Valley Days is fast approaching! Our single biggest fund raising event is the Single Action Shooting Society (SASS) Maryland State Championship of Cowboy

Airgun Show

The 5th Annual Mid-Atlantic Airgun Show will be held at the Chapter House on **Saturday, August 11, 2001**. The show, especially for airguns and related equipment, will feature two floors of modern and antique air rifles, air pistols, targets, pellets, telescopic sights, and other supplies for sale. The hours of the show are 9:00 AM till 4:00 PM and the admission price is \$5.00 for adults (**a \$1.00 discount for chapter members with their membership card**) and \$3.00 for children. Refreshments and drinks

will be available during the day.
