

Skeet and Trap Report

FUN SHOOT: On September 8, there will be a Scattergun Fun Shoot. Six events are planned: Skeet, Trap, Skeet Doubles, 28/410 Ga. Skeet, 5 Stand, and Chinese Trap. The cost will be \$30 for all 6 events or \$8 for individual events. Prizes are: High Overall receives one full case of shells (20 boxes), 1st in each event wins 1 flat of shells, 2nd in each event wins a box of shells. Each participant qualifies for one first place prize. Thanks to Bill Rahn for getting the ball rolling on this shoot.

THIRD ANNUAL CHARITY SKEET SHOOT: On September 22 and 23, 2001, we will hold our annual Charity Skeet Shoot to benefit Damascus Help. Rifle and Pistol Range Report

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For August 2001, starting time is 10:00 AM and ending time is 8:00 PM daily, unless some activity has preempted the range. This is the latest ending time permitted by WAC policy, and will remain in place until late August. Please help us be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the

posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

UPCOMING BOWLING PIN SHOOT:

The second of what may become a regular monthly bowling pin shoot will be held on the uncovered pistol range from 10:00 AM until 2:00 PM on Saturday, September 29. The title for the match is "Bowling at Home." Please do not go directly to the range. Bowling pin shooters will meet at the Chapter house at 9:00 AM for registration. There will be a \$4.00 registration fee to help defray the costs incurred by our club in running this event.

SIGN-IN REGISTER: The requirement to sign in and out on the range sign-in register did not change with the installation of the barrier gate. Although the keycard owner's name is recorded with each use, the sign-in register entries provide a more accurate reflection of range use by identifying all persons who may have passed through the gate along with the keycard owner. Furthermore, when we see a car pull into the site and head directly to the barrier gate, we must assume that it is somebody who doesn't know the rules, who wants to avoid being seen at the sign-in register, or who is purposely ignoring the rules. A person who doesn't know the rules or wants to avoid being seen may be someone who has acquired the keycard through some illegitimate means. We definitely don't want them on the rifle and pistol ranges. We also don't want someone who is purposely flaunting the rules there either.

RANGE MAINTENANCE: Range and site maintenance will be done from 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM on Sunday, August 26. Please report to the green equipment shed for an assignment.

CAN'T MAKE MAINTENANCE DAY? In addition to helping the Chapter, participation in a scheduled Chapter project, like the monthly range and site maintenance day. provides a chance to meet other members and enjoy their company. Unfortunately, not everyone can attend scheduled events, but there are plenty of Chapter projects that can be done independently, as one's schedule allows. For example, our stand of Christmas trees always needs care, such as mowing or removing vines and other growth. Trimming brush at the sides of the range road and picking up trash on the ranges are also functions that can be done at any time. Just look around. If you see something that needs clearing, cleaning, fixing, or some other improvement, it is fair game. And for first year members who need credit for Chapter projects. just let one of our club officers or committee chairmen know what you accomplished and roughly how long it took. The Howard County Parks deer hunter qualification event will be held on the rifle range on Sunday morning, September 23. Unlike past years, the pistol ranges will be open to WAC members during this event.
