#### RIFLE AND PISTOL Range Report

INFORMATION: For more information about any of the rifle/pistol range activities mentioned in this article, contact Ray Shaver by e-mail at MRShaver@aol.com or telephone at 301-926-0465.

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For December 2001, starting time is 10 AM daily and ending time is 4:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. However, because sunset comes a little earlier each day this time of year, ending time may change before the month ends. Please help us to be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

NRA INSTRUCTOR TRAINING: Courses to train and certify NRA pistol and personal protection course instructors are being held at the Wildlife Achievement Chapter on December 8, 9, 15, 16 and 22. Although these are primarily classroom-based activities, it is possible that the participants (all of whom are WAC members) may use the pistol ranges for some exercises. The ranges have not been reserved for their use. We trust that pistol range users will do their best to accommodate the class members if they should show up on the range.

BOWLING PIN FUN SHOOTS: The November 10 shoot drew a nice crowd of 27 shooters, six of whom were members of a junior team hosted by Larry Collins. The junior shooters (Charles R. Cassell, Jessica Latos, Megan Diane Collins, Michael Wade, Brett Daugherty and Chad Collins) acquitted themselves well in the competition, achieving an overall average score of 5.5 out of 12 compared to 4.7 for the twenty one adult shooters.

If you haven't yet attended one of the monthly bowling pin shoots, please come out to watch or give it a try. Upcoming shoots are planned for January 19, February 23, and March 30, 2002; all from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. Please do not go

directly to the range. Bowling pin shooters will meet at the chapter house for registration. INTOLERANCE ENCOURAGED: The new forty and fifty yard markers on the covered pistol range didn"t last a month. By November 24, they were completely destroyed, possibly by accident, but the level of destruction implies it was purposeful. Perhaps the vandal was alone on the range, but there is a good chance that another member was present and either didn't notice, or chose not to get involved. We know that nobody likes a confrontation, but failure to act when you observe behavior that may result in personal injury or property damage is equivalent to supporting such activity. The property being damaged belongs to us all. Please don "t tolerate careless shooting or vandalism on our ranges.

SAFETY REMINDER: A safety infraction observed frequently on the rifle range is that of using a target frame which is not directly in front of the shooting position. This usually involves the 25-yard target frames, and unfortunately, is most dangerous with those frames. The reason is that a diagonal shot can result in bullets leaving the range. Please ensure that the target being fired upon is directly in front of your shooting position, and has an earth bank backstop directly behind it. If the target frame which you want to use is in front of a bench being used by another shooter, please ask whether you can switch benches. During the November range maintenance, we installed a fourth rifle range target frame at 25 yards to help meet the needs of our shooters. Please use it safely.

WARNING: Fully automatic firearms and any firearms modified to make them fire multiple shots from one trigger pull are prohibited from the WAC ranges. If you want to continue using our ranges, don"t even bring such firearms to the range.

RANGE ROAD UPDATE: Contrary to last month's report, we will not be rushing to put in a concrete pad in the area of the range road being damaged by the spinning tires on exiting vehicles. Carr (429), Aleem Sheikh (392) and Chad Collins Instead, we are experimenting with an approach in which the damaged areas are repaired by burying concrete blocks with their holes up and filling in around them with the original earth and crushed stone surface. If will take at least a month to judge the effectiveness of this approach. Regardless of road changes, you can help reduce the damage by backing down the hill a little after the gate opens and accelerating slowly to avoid spinning your wheels. You don"t need to be in a hurry after triggering the gate; it will stay open until you pass through.

DECEMBER SITE MAINTENANCE: Monthly maintenance of WAC ranges, Christmas trees, house and grounds will be done from 10 AM until 1 PM on Sunday, December 30. Please report to the maintenance coordinator, Tom Riley, at the green equipment shed for an assignment. There is a lot of work that needs to be done before Winter sets in school.

#### YOUTH AIR RIFLE

The inaugural Maryland Division, Izaak Walton League of America, Inc. Three-Position Air Rifle Championship Match was held on Saturday, November 3, 2001 at our Chapter House with 17 competitors, representing three Chapters, competing in the sporter and precision categories.

Our WAC Air Rifle Club won the team gold medals in sporter class with a team score of 1673. The Gold Medal

winning team consisted of Kate Duncan (488), Andy (364). Kate Duncan won a second Gold Medal as overall sporter class winner.

The overall precision class winner was Kristina Fehlings representing Northern Virginia with a score of 572 while Brian Watson representing WAC was the Maryland precision Gold Medal winner with a score of 564

The Fall 2001 Gaithersburg HS JNROTC vs. Damascus Air Rifle Club match was held on Saturday, November 10, 2001 at our facility. Eighteen competitors competed in a renewal of a long standing competit ion for temporary possession of a traveling trophy. Each club provided two teams of four shooters each. In an extremely close competition, the Damascus "RED" team, consisting of Daniel Pearce, Megan Bobrow, Kate Duncan, and Kevin Gracey with a score of 916/1200 defeated the Gaithersburg "BLUE" team by a mere 4 points.
