SKEET AND TRAP REPORT

Beginning Wednesday, April 10th, the Shotgun Ranges will be open from 2:00 p.m. to 7 p.m.. These hours will remain in effect until the thime changes back to Eastern Standard time in October.

RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE REPORT

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For April 2002, starting time is 10 AM daily and ending time is 7:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. However, because sunset comes a little later each day this time of year, ending time may change before the month ends. Please help us to be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

22 JUNIORS ONLY FUN SHOOT: Families are encouraged to attend our .22 sporter junior fun shoot from 10:00 AM until approximately 1:00 PM on Sunday, April 21st. There is no charge and no chance of embarrassment for participants in this informal, non-competitive event. Only juniors (age 20 or less) will be permitted to shoot. Because it is a special event, the juniors will be able to shoot at the chapter's steel knock down targets and silhouettes, along with novelty targets like balloons and earth-bound clay pigeons. Bring a .22 rimfire rifle, (short, long, long-rifle, but not .22 WRM magnum, please) and lots of inexpensive .22 ammunition, plus eye and ear protection. MILITARY RIFLE FUN SHOOT: Bob Inness reports that this March 17 event was successful in spite of cold air and intermittent rain. The sign in sheet shows that seventeen intrepid shooters braved the weather and participated. Our shooters' ages varied from 13 to 63. Garands were the most often seen rifle on the line, however a Mauser, an SMLE, SKSes, and AR-15s as well as several military ,22s were also present. Assisting Bob in running the event were Wayne Berkebile, Goeff Hornseth, and Jim Piateski. All shooters participated in, (and are commended for.) policing the range following the event.

BOWLING PIN FUN SHOOT: The next monthly bowling pin fun shoot will take place on April 20. As you will find out, if you attend, this is not a "standard" bowling pin shoot. For example, the March targets included golf balls, which were clearly a challenge to hit at 25 yards. Jesse Lim and others involved in this event are looking into the possibilities of extending it to include some IDPA-type tactical shooting events limited to WAC members. Join them on April 20 to see what is happening. Please note that participants will meet at 9 AM in the Rathskeller; don't go directly to the range.

SAFETY REMINDER: Although the ranges have remained busy during the past mild winter, the arrival of spring will certainly increase range activity even more. Please remember that our ability to keep the ranges open almost every day throughout the year depends upon the fact that all range-approved WAC shooters are pledged to serve as range officers and to help ensure that the range rules and regulations are being followed whenever they are at For reference when the range. questions arise, copies of the range rules are posted on the bulletin boards at both the rifle range and covered pistol range. The WAC has invested a

lot of time and money over the past several years ensuring compliance with the special zoning exemptions which permit the operation of our ranges. So there is little sympathy or patience among the board of directors for any member who voluntarily violates the range rules, putting our permit to operate the ranges at risk. Intentional violations can be expected to result in. at least, a temporary revocation of range-approved status and, depending upon the violation, possible expulsion from membership in the WAC. PLEASE SHOOT SAFELY AND ENJOY THE RANGES.

APRIL SITE MAINTENANCE: The next monthly maintenance of WAC ranges, Christmas trees, house and grounds will be done from 10 AM until 1 PM on Sunday, April 28. One of our tasks this month will be to plant 800 Christmas trees. Please report to the maintenance coordinator, Tom Riley, at the green equipment shed for an assignment.
