RIFLE & PISTOL RANGE REPORT

INFORMATION: For more information about any of the rifle/pistol range activities mentioned in this article, contact **Ray Shaver** by e-mail at **MRShaver@aol.com** or telephone at **301-926-0465**.

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For October 2002, starting time is 10 AM daily and ending time is 6:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range. However, because sunset comes a little earlier each day this time of year, ending time is likely to change before the month ends. Please help us to be a good neighbor by firing no shots before the posted starting time and none after the posted ending time.

BOWLING PIN/PRACTICAL DEFENSE MATCHES: A bowling pin fun shoot will be held on Saturday, October 19, from 1:00 PM to 6:00 PM. Please note that participants will meet at 1:00 PM in the Rathskeller; don't go directly to the range. HUNTER SIGHT-IN DAY (Nov. 3): One of the WAC public services in support of hunting safety is the annual hunter sight-in day, at which our rifle range is open to the public. The objective is to provide hunters with a chance to ensure that the firearms and ammunition with which they will be hunting are accurately shooting where aimed. For a fee of \$5 per firearm, we provide access to the rifle range for sighting in at distances up to 100 yards, plus targets and assistance as needed. This year's hunter sight-in day will be held on Sunday, November 3 from 10 AM until 3 PM. Although some benches will be reserved for participants, the rifle range will remain open to WAC members during this event. Your patience and cooperation are appreciated.

DEER HUNTER QUALIFICATION (Nov. 10): Slug-gun qualification for participants in Montgomery County managed deer hunts will be held on Sunday, November 10, from 10 AM until 12:30 PM. Although the rifle range is closed during this event, the pistol ranges will be open for use by WAC members. However, because of the high number of participants in this event, the range road and range parking areas are open only to handicapped persons. Consequently, it will be necessary for WAC pistol range users to park at the Chapter house and walk down. Please comply with directions of our parking crew. We will make every effort to open the rifle range to members as quickly as possible after the qualification is completed.

RANGE LITTER: A longtime member of the WAC called recently to express his dismay over the litter of shell cases he encounters frequently on the pistol range. His concern is understood and appreciated. Even if it were not one of our range rules, picking up your expended cartridges at the end of a shooting session is common courtesy. We do not employ a staff to clean up after our shooters. If you don't pick up your debris, another member will have to do it. The brass and aluminum cases which you don't take with you should be placed in an appropriate recycling (provided on the ranges); steel cases should be discarded in the trash. Also, each range has at least one container specifically dedicated to aluminum cans, please use it. We are counting on you to leave the shooting areas at least as litter free as they were when you arrived at the range (preferably better).

LOST AND FOUND: Items found on the rifle and pistol ranges are usually collected in the WAC office located in the basement of the chapter house. One of the more notable items currently in residence is a chronograph which was found Sept. 6 on the pistol range. To recover an item which you've lost, please contact one of the WAC officers.

JUNIORS COMMENCE REGULAR PRACTICE

We also have started a "standby" or "wait" list for those who wish to join our club when space becomes available. Our first formal match competitions occur in November. We have a number of very talented young competitors in our midst, and look forward to another successful season!

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

In reminder of the reason for the IWLA's founding, the Conservation Committee is selling T- shirts with an original, multi-color design on the back which emphasizes the message of wise stewardship.

They also have the IWLA pledge on the front for those of us with less than perfect memory! They come in gray or white, M-XXL, at \$15. And while you have your wallets out, don't forget to buy honey from the Chapter's very own beehives -- \$2.00 for a half-pint, \$3.50 for a pint. In addition to the annual Patuxent Watershed Clean-Up, the Conservation Committee is moving forward with a variety of new activities: beginning a nursery for Dutch Elm disease resistant American Elms; a pilot project with these Elms to prove their suitability in the County's urban areas; sessions on making Rain Barrels and using Rain Gardens and other Native Plant Landscaping techniques; and becoming Weed Warriors (controlling invasives) in the Hawlings River watershed. We welcome all members' ideas in developing these activities and we will be asking for more help as the events are scheduled over the next year or two.
