### CONSERVATION REPORT

On March 28 we planted over 100 disease resistant American Elms. This is the first planting in our chapters Elm tree farm. With the rain we have had over the last week the trees should be off to a good start. More work still needs to be done, such as installing the drip irrigation system, slaking the trees, and possibly installing tree protection. If you are interested in helping please be sure you are on the chapter e-mail list (see the web site). During the same workday we also installed the rain barrel at the range house, and a bird box near the blue hummingbird garden. The blue bird house has already been occupied by some blue birds!

On April 3 we held the annual watershed clean up. This year we combined the watershed clean up with Adopt-a-Road. This allowed us to take advantage of some of the services the county provides in support of the Adopt-a-Road We also received program. from two local support businesses, the Home Depot and Target stores in Germantown. Despite poor weather I believe this year's clean up was a success. I'd like to thank all of the people that helped to run this year's event and the chapter members that showed up to support the event. There were 65 attendees, 45 or which were chapter members and their family. This was verv good representation for the chapter, which is sometimes out numbered by non-members at this event. We are already talking about how we can do even better next year.
