SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For April 2005, starting time is 10 AM daily and ending time is 7:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range.

.22 FUN SHOOT MAY 14: Everybody is welcome and families are encouraged to attend our first .22 rimfire rifle fun shoot of 2005. It will be held from 10:00 AM until approximately 12:30 PM on Saturday, May 14. Participants in this special event will be able to shoot at the chapter's steel knock-down targets and silhouettes, along with novelty targets like balloons and earth-bound clay pigeons. Bring a .22 rimfire rifle (i.e., short, long, long-rifle, but not .22 WRM please), lots of inexpensive .22 ammunition, plus eye and ear protection for participants and observers. HANDGUN SHOOTERS: Have you considered getting involved in the monthly bowling pin/practical defense matches at the WAC pistol range? Jesse Lim reports that the Practical Defense Match from 1:00 to 5:00 PM on Saturday, May 21, will include a repeat of the safety class for firearms handling and use of holsters. This afternoon short course is for both new practical defense shooters and returning members of the group. Upon successful completion of the afternoon firearms firing test course, each shooter will be entitled to receive a Certificate of Sportsmanship. This qualification is required for the use of holsters in our local practical defense matches. Attendees will need a standard pistol or double action revolver in good condition (no modified competition compensated pistol or revolver, or single action revolvers please) and about 100 rounds of factory ammunition (no reloads). Holsters must be in excellent condition and a hip holster is mandatory (no antique holster or collectors' holster please). There is a \$5.00 fee (which goes to the WAC) for each participant. Registration for the course and associated match will start at noon at the open pistol range (range #1). We will use it to provide general information about shooting hours and regular range closings, and will specifically use it to provide last minute status information about scheduled events. This supplements our use of email to try to keep interested parties informed about an event, and reduces the necessity of making premature announcements about closings. Thus, general shooters can check to see whether the ranges may be closed before driving out to the WAC, or those planning to attend a rifle/pistol event can check at the last minute to see whether it is still on. RANGE RULE REMINDER

As the warm weather approaches, the Shotgun Ranges are likely to become quite busy, and with the increased number of shooters the potential for safety concerns needs to be considered. Below are some of the Primary Safety items taken from the WAC Shotgun Range Rules. Please take a look to refresh your memory, and when you get a chance review the complete WAC range rules. Copies are available in the Range House and on the Chapter Website. And remember, it is each of our responsibility to identify and correct safety issues. Even more importantly, if someone questions you on a safety issue, do not be offended or embarrassed. Observing and practicing safe firearm procedures benefit everyone.

- Always keep the firearm pointed in a safe direction.
- Eye and ear protection is required for all personnel in the range area located beyond the safety fence.
- Firearms will only be loaded at the shooting station immediately prior to shooting.
- Alcohol and other drugs are not permitted on ranges or range spectator areas. No ingestion of alcohol or other drugs is allowed before or during shooting. Persons under the influence of alcohol or other drugs are not permitted on ranges or range spectator areas.
- Only lead shot may be used on the shotgun ranges, sizes 7 1/2, 8, or
 9. No steel, solid projectile, or magnum powered loads are permitted.
- When Shooting Skeet station 8, load only 1 shell for the high house, clear firearm, reposition for low house and reload. Do not turn around with a loaded firearm.

- The command to "CEASE FIRE" must be obeyed immediately.
- All members are expected to maintain an attitude of SAFETY, PATIENCE, and COURTESY at all times when using the ranges.
- All members and guests using the shotgun ranges must sign the range register before proceeding to the ranges.
- Members sponsoring guests using the Chapter facilities are personally responsible for the conduct of their guests.
- In the event of a machine malfunction, immediately notify a Range Officer. Do not attempt to repair the machine.

Any person witnessing a violation of the Range Rules and Regulations or safety standards is responsible for calling it to the violators attention. If the violator is argumentative or uncooperative, disengage immediately and report the violator's identity or vehicle license number to the Chapter caretaker, a Range Safety Officer or other Chapter official. Emergency calls to 911 are authorized if conditions present the possibility of injury to anyone.

Chapter and county engineers began working feverishly to identify a workaround or 'patch' for this bug. It was with great pride that a field upgrade from the Mark IV to Mark V barrel was released in time for workshop participants to assemble their new and improved Rain Barrels! We collected over 100 tires from two dump sites as well as sofas, roofing material, a water heater, and two gas tanks.
