RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE REPORT

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle/pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box which contains the range sign-in register. For June 2005, starting time is 10 AM daily and ending time is 8:00 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range.

RANGE SAFETY: Alcohol and shooting are not good companions. Item 21under SAFETY in the WAC Rifle/Pistol Range Rules and Regulations is clear about its prohibition on or around our ranges. DON'T EXPECT ANY LENIENCY IF YOU ARE CAUGHT BREAKING THIS RULE. Specifically: Alcohol and other drugs are not permitted on ranges or range spectator areas. No ingestion of alcohol or other drugs is allowed before or during shooting. Persons under the influence of alcohol or other drugs are not permitted on ranges or range spectator areas.

CONSERVATION REPORT

Progress continues in our collaboration with Lois Green-Sligo Chapter. Norma Kawecki reported two contacts as a result of the article in the Maryland Waltonian: one inquiring about membership, the other an offer to see what can be done with two tractors at Lois Green-Sligo. We also have the donation of a dumpster for the June 7 conservation meeting and workday.

Twelve members (including three new members) participated in a conservation work day on Sunday May 22. This was an excellent turn out and we were able to accomplish all of our goals which included cleaning around the elms and installing tree shelters, and doing maintenance on the butterfly and rain Installation of the tree gardens. shelters allowed us to asses how the trees were doing - considering the neglect and deer browsing they are doing quite well with 50 to 60% survival since planting. In addition to the work done on Sunday Tom Riley and Pete Dubroff worked on Friday May 20 and Saturday May 21 to install the main line for the irrigation system for the elms. We hope to complete installation of the irrigation system this year. This should help the survival of replacement trees we will be planting and future growth of all of the elm trees.

TARGET CLINIC

Any rifle, any iron sight target clinic will be offered on July 9 at the Chapter House beginning at 9:00 AM. The introductory clinic will last approximately one hour followed by a live fire exercise at the rifle range beginning at 10:00 - 10:30 AM. Participants should bring their own rifles and 60 rounds of ammunition. The rifles can be either center fire or rim fire. The live fire exercise will follow the NRA's 50 round National Match Course of fire. Each participant must have adequate eye and hearing protection. Additional items, such as shooting mats and spotting scopes, will be provided if the clinic participant does not have their own accessories.

Clinic participants will be paired with experienced shooters during the live fire exercise. Those that complete the clinic will be eligible for Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) qualification and the purchase of rifles, ammunition and accessories offered by CMP. Participants will be well on their way to participation in future center fire events on a regular basis.

Prior experience is not necessary.

Open to all Chapter members and their family. Juniors should be 16 or older and accompanied by a parent or guardian.
