# CHAPTER NEWS, EVENTS AND ARTICLES

## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

The IWLA -WAC Board of Directors has accepted and approved three amendments to our Chapter's Bylaws. Before these amendments can take effect, they must be

approved by a two thirds vote of the membership, at our March 22nd, 2006 membership meeting.

#### Article III - Membership Section 5

### Current Reading;

All members who have been elected to membership in the chapter shall undergo one year probation, this probation period to terminate one year from the date which they were elected to membership. During this probationary period, all new members will be required to work on a minimum of two Chapter events. Events can be fundraisers or committee functions requiring a work detail as sponsored by the Board of Directors. New members failing to meet this requirement will be ineligible for membership renewal for one year, after which application can be made as a new member. During this probationary period, the member may be expelled by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors present at a regularly scheduled meeting. Upon expulsion under this section, all unused dues will be returned.

#### Proposed Amendment Article III - Membership Section 5

All newly elected members shall undergo a probationary period, no more than three years in length. The probationary period is determined by the Board of Directors, and will be provided in writing to new members prior to their being presented to the BOD for consideration.

During this period, all probationary members will be required to participate in Chapter activities. Activities may include, but are not limited to: Chapter maintenance days, event fundraisers, committee projects, conservation projects or Chapter Social events.

New members failing to meet this requirement will be ineligible for membership renewal for one year, after which, application can be submitted as a new member. During the probationary period, the member may be expelled by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors present at a regularly scheduled meeting. Upon expulsion, under this section, all unused dues will be refunded. Current probationary requirements will be listed on the membership application in use at the time. For applicants with special needs, a written request for an exemption can be filed with the Board of Directors for consideration.

## Article V - Duties of Officers

## Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall: Sub Section b.

#### **Current Reading:**

b. prepare and mail the monthly bulletin and notices of membership and Board of Directors meetings, and

#### Article XV - Amendments Current Reading

These Bylaws may be amended or repealed, or new Bylaws may be adopted, by two-thirds vote of the members in good standing, present and voting at a meeting of the Chapter provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing at a prior meeting, and that notice of the proposed change, and the date at which the proposed change is to be voted on, shall be mailed by the Corresponding Secretary to each member, not less than thirty days prior to the date of the meeting at which the action thereon shall be taken.

Other than a few cages damaged by falling limbs or trees everything looked fine. Of course, it has only been about three months since the trees were planted... Students and teachers from Northwood High School will monitor the growth and survival of the trees and help us in performing periodic maintenance of the planting. ## **RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE REPORT**

Attention All Rifle Range Shooters (Tom Riley) Beginning February 01, 2006 until its completion, a berm is going to be built on the rifle range. It will be built on the left side of the rifle range and on the left side of the #1 shooting position, using the 100-yard marker as a reference; this is the berm that is used for the cowboy shoots at station # 3, at the 75-yard marker. The new berm is being built to better protect the cowboy shooters and will not encroach on the shooting area of the rifle range shooters.

We only ask for the patience of the shooters as we bring in material to build the berm; and during the weekdays, from time to time, we will need to "Call the Range COLD." It's going to take time to build. We will advise all shooters of our headway and plans as they arise and change on the club's web sight.

Shooting Hours: Permitted rifle and pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box, which contains the range sign-in register, as well as above the range entry card reader. For February 2006, starting time is 10:00 AM daily and ending time is 5:30 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range (see "Upcoming Events Affecting Range Availability" below).

Range Rules Violations: Recently there have been several conduct rules violations on our ranges. In two cases members failed to sign-in and out of the range. This violates Rule 6 under Conduct. This Rule states, "All members and guests using the rifle and pistol ranges must sign the range register before proceeding to the ranges, and sign out on the same register before leaving the Chapter grounds."

Violation of Rule 6 invokes Rule 1 that states, "Unauthorized persons using the rifle/pistol ranges will be deemed trespassing. Unauthorized rifle/pistol range users include anyone who does not display a current rangeapproved membership card, has not signed the range register, has or is a guest who has not signed the range register, or is violating any directives restricting access for use of the ranges."

Periodic audits of Range Sign-in Rosters and electronic gate activation entries are used to identify violators. Every time a keycard is used to enter the range or Chapter house, a computer records many data points. These include member name, number, date, location, and time. This provides information about members who were present when misconduct occurs and will aid the Range Rules Violations Subcommittee in their investigation.

On Saturday January 14, 2006 several sandbags were removed from the rifle range. One of these was found at the 50 yard berm and had suffered more than a few bullet holes. This behavior along with that of shooting at lane number indicators is dangerous, childish, and if substantiated may result in invoking Conduct Rule 18 which states, "The cost of repairs for any damage to Chapter property and the possible loss of range privileges will be assessed for violations of these rules and regulations."

In all cases these violations are referred to the Range Rules Violations Subcommittee whose members are current or past Chapter officers and Committee chairmen. Serious and flagrant violations may ultimately result in expulsion from the Club in accordance with Article X of the By-Laws.

Covered Pistol Range: You may notice that the covered pistol range shelter has upgraded insulation for sound abatement and complete enclosure with chicken wire to keep out the local fauna. Many thanks to Al Goldschmidts and Ray Shaver for coming out on a rainy day to complete this project.

#### JUNIOR AIR RIFLE (Bob Inness)

A DARC SHOOTER EARNS A MAJOR HONOR On January 7th, eight of our precision shooters participated in the Junior Olympic Regional Qualifying Match held at the U. S. Naval Academy. Among those participating, Azeem Sheikh of Gaithersburg, Maryland competing in the youngest age category (J3) fired an impressive 533/600 in this all-standing position match. While that was not the winning score, nor the high score for our shooters, it is an impressive score for a thirteen year old competitor.

On January 21st, eight of our precision shooters competed in the 2006 NRA Classified 3 Position competition held at the Chapter House. Nineteen shooters representing five clubs participated in this match. Azeem's older brother, Aleem Sheikh, captured third place overall, winning the Bronze medal with a score of 570/600. Azeem earned the first sharpshooter medal in that same competition with a score of 552/600.

Last week, Azeem was notified that his score at the Naval Academy Match earned him an invitation to participate in the 2006 USA Shooting Junior Olympic National Championship Air Rifle Program to be held at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, in March of this year.

Azeem will attend the match, accompanied by one of the DARC precision coaches. He will practice and compete on the range our Olympic team calls home with and against some of the very best junior air rifle competitors in the country.
