CHAPTER NEWS, EVENTS AND ARTICLES

JUNIOR AIR GUN (Bob Inness); Report by Chuck Limparis CHAPTER RECEIVES NRA FOUNDATION GRANT In mid May, our Chapter received a NRA Foundation Grant of \$800.00, to be used for equipment acquisition for our Junior Rifle Program. This is the second such grant we have received in the past two years.

In Maryland, a committee composed of all of the sponsors of "Friends of the NRA" dinners in the state, determine who will receive grants and what size they will be. Each year total requests for grants are nearly triple the amount actually available to distribute. All of the funds to support this program are earned at those dinners. We encourage our Chapter members to attend and support those dinners. Our program has received more than \$3,000 in grants from this program.

Junior Air Report

On 20 May 2006, the Junior Air Rifle program concluded its regular season with its annual picnic and awards ceremony. Three of our Junior shooters earned the NRA Distinguished Expert classification this year. This is the highest level NRA recognizes and 15 of our kids have earned this distinction in the past 8 years. A truly remarkable accomplishment!

At this time we still have two precision teams that will be traveling to National competitions. One team will be traveling to Kentucky to compete in the USA Shooting National Junior Olympics the first week of July and a second team will be traveling to Redmond, Oregon to compete in the NRA Nationals also the first week of July.

Unfortunately, our Sporter shooters will not be able to attend the NRA Nationals in Oregon with the precision team. The teams that travel to the NRA national competition are State teams formed from the best shooters in Maryland. The Sporter team was to be comprised of two shooters from our club and two shooters, one from each of two other clubs. Due in large part to the expense of travel, the shooters from the other clubs were not able to attend and thus we were forced to scrub the Sporter team for this year.

I am also saddened to report that our long time Junior Air Rifle Chairman, Bob Inness announced his resignation from the program at the end of this season. Bob, will now be focusing his efforts on selling his house and retiring to North Carolina. There is no way that the kids who have been through this program or the other coaches could ever thank him enough for his tireless efforts on behalf of "His" kids. THANK YOU BOB!!!!!!!

The remaining coaches are presently regrouping and reassigning duties and we are already making plans for next season. While Bob's expertise and dedication to the program will never be replaceable, we are looking forward to another great season next year, albeit with a few bumps along the way.

DARC Rifle Raffle

Once again we have had an extremely successful year with our Junior Air Rifle program. We are extremely proud of these kids and their success winning the right to have two teams attend National events this year. That success carries with it the price of raising the money to assist them with the cost of travel to these matches. Many of the coaches donate not only their time, but most of their travel costs to these matches, however this still leaves these kids with costs of up to \$1,200.00 per shooter to attend these National matches.

To offset some of those costs, we are again raffling a rifle with all proceeds directly benefiting the Junior Air Rifle Program. The Grand Prize is a new Marlin 1894 Lever Action Cowboy Rifle in either .45 Colt, 38Spcl/357Mag, or 44Spcl/44Mag, winners choice. As an alternate, the winner can elect to receive \$500.00 cash. All proceeds from this raffle directly benefit the Junior Air Rifle program, specifically helping to defray the cost of travel to these national matches.

The tickets went on sale at the Bull Roast and will be on sale at general membership meetings and Cowboy Shoots. They cost \$5.00 each or you can get 5 tickets for \$20.00. Only 750 tickets will be sold and 250 are already gone, So Don't Delay! We hope we can count on your support.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE (Jeff Deschamps) Got your rain barrel yet? Although most areas are still green we are already well below normal for rainfall. The 'normal' year-to-date precipitation at BWI airport is 18.62" while our current year-to-date total is only 11.64"... almost 7" BELOW normal! We may not yet be in a drought but it has certainly been dry.

In addition to using rain barrels for gardening there are other measures you can take at home to decrease your use of water. When designing or re-planting gardens around your home consider native plants (plants found in the region prior to European settlement). Use of native plants is one component of environmentally friendly landscaping. These diverse and beautiful plants are not only used by wildlife for food, cover and shelter, they can save you energy, time and money. An example of the native grass you can use in landscaping is "Big Bluestem" (Andropogon gerardi). According to the Rainscapes web site big bluestem can reach up to ten feet in height and prefers full sun, although it is tolerant of partial shade and either moist heavy, or sandy, drier soils. Like most native grasses, it prefers being left alone, and fertilizing or unnecessary watering will simply lead to floppy growth. This is a tough plant! Native plants have evolved to tolerate the conditions of this region. Use them and you should end up with a more drought tolerant landscape.
