COMMITTEE REPORTS

CONSERVATION REPORT

In transitioning from 7" BELOW normal rainfall to our current rainfall surplus the June workday was literally a washout. Thanks to the nine volunteers that joined Meo Curtis and Jeff Deschamps we were able to do maintenance on some of the gardens, install timbers around the garden behind the chapter house, and remove the pile of mulch from the front of the chapter house.

The Talbot county chapter has been concerned about a proposed development adjacent to the Blackwater Refuge since early this year. At a hearing in May those who testified in opposition to the project outnumbered those in favor 21 to 1. Despite this opposition on June 6 the Cambridge Planning and Zoning Commission made a favorable recommendation on the Blackwater Resort Communities development! There are still many concerns about this development, which is at least partially in the critical area. Alan Girard (of the Chesapeake Bay Foundation (CBF)) said, "This development remains the wrong project in the wrong place. The revised plan does nothing to alter that conclusion... The project still lacks any scientific data or precise plans to establish that it will not harm the Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge and surrounding environment." If you would like to help action against this development go to the CBF web site (http://www.cbf.org/) and look for STOP BLACKWATER NOW to find the link where you can sign a petition. It is not too late as the project still needs to receive additional approvals before it can go forward so sign the petition and let legislators known the extent of opposition to this proposed development.

The August meeting of the Conservation Committee has been canceled. The next regular meeting of the committee is Wednesday September 6 at 6:30 pm.
