DIFTA NOVEMBER MATCH (Joe McDaniel)

Our LMOTY (Last Match of the Year) was a bit different than our usual matches. The course included three lanes with British Rules (1 min/target, 1 shot/target) with one lane each being offhand, kneeling, and prone. One additional lane was "rapid fire" -- this lane had a silhouette-style practice target with five flippers and one (Long Tom) normal field target at a different distance. Each shooter had a total of 3 minutes for this lane. There was some trepidation when announcing this new format but, at the end of the match, all declared it a success. The weather was excellent albeit a bit cool with temperatures in the 40s and low 50s and a good breeze blowing the entire match. The DIFTA lanes are usually very well shaded from both the sun and wind but the first and last matches of the year offer an opportunity for some serious wind "doping" when the leaves are mostly off the

It is hard to estimate the course difficulty because of the wind as well as timing and format changes -- the nominal difficulty was 28T but this does not include wind or timing. The only change in the course design might be to increase the difficulty of the prone lane as several people chose to shoot it kneeling or standing with (too good?) success. Possibly, we might put the silhouette flipper target out a bit further or something more "chicken" size chosen. The total number of shots was 60.

We have set the schedule for 2008. The dates are April 12 (Fun Match), April 19, May 3, June 21, July 26 (Maryland State Championship), August 16, September 20, October 4 (Fun Shoot), October 18, and November 1.

Apologies for the results being limited to just names and scores -- the registration cards were left at the range.

CHANGES IN RANGE ACCESS RULES (Joe Gick)

59

As of April 1, 2007, every member who shoots on *any range*, including the rifle range, pistol ranges, outdoor air rifle range, the archery range, and the skeet/trap ranges, must be visibly wearing a Range Access card. If you do not have one, you must attend a Range Orientation class, held at 10:00 A.M. on the last Sunday of the month. (Check the online calendar at www.damascusIWLA.org)

The only exception to wearing a Range Access card is if you are shooting in an event where non-members are invited that are not specific guests of members under current Chapter Rules. Such events include Cowboy Action Shoots, Seneca Valley Matches, Breaking Clay to Save the Bay, etc.

CONSERVATION (Jeff Deschamps)

During the last two meetings of the conservation committee, we have been making plans for next year. We are putting the final touches onto the conservation events for next year's calendar. We are continuing the elm and chestnut tree projects as well as workshops that have been popular in the past. Thanks to all who supported our Adopt-A-Road/Fall Watershed Clean up on Saturday October 20. There were about 25 members, new and renewed, so we covered not only Mullinix Mill Road from Rte. 108 to the Patuxent River, but also Long Corner Road from Rte. 108 to the River, Gue Rd. from Howard Chapel Rd. to Long Corner Rd., Annapolis Rock Rd., and Howard Chapel Rd. near Unity. We collected approximately 45 bags of trash, plus two tires and four 5-gallon buckets of used driveway sealer in about 2.5 hrs. Beverage containers (plastic, cans, glass) were by far the predominant type of trash (as much as 50% by volume). Fast food and other packaging was the second highest category of trash.

ADULT AIR GUN (Phil Dean)

There might be some WAC-IWLA members who are not yet aware of our Adult Airgun Program. On Monday nights, we have 10-meter air pistol shooting in the downstairs indoor range. We fire a 60 shot match following NRA rules. Scores are recorded so participants can see how they are improving during the year. A number of the 'Monday night shooters' are using some of the targets fired to participate in an air pistol postal match where their performance will be listed along with air pistol shooters in a number of different states and several foreign countries. If you want to come out, we can provide an air pistol for you to use if you don't currently have one. You may also fire air rifles during the Monday night session. Range set up begins at 6:30 PM and we start firing about 7:00 PM. We are generally finished by 8:30 PM.

There is an outdoor air gun range in the woods beyond the end of the trap and skeet range with a covered firing area with shooting benches where you can fire air rifles and air pistols at targets from 10 yards to 50 yards. Target frames for paper targets are on the range as well as metal spinner targets, hanging cans, and three sets of silhouette targets. We also try to keep at least one field target set up for your use. Relevant chapter range rules apply to the use of the airgun ranges.

In addition to practice, we occasionally have "competitions". On a recent Monday, we had a fun jack-o-lantern shoot. We made targets using jack-o-lantern stickers as the "bulls-eye". The two shooters who shot closest to the nose received a bag of candy. Phil Dean was the winner and Tim Avara a close second. Congratulations!

SHOOTING HOURS: Permitted rifle and pistol range shooting hours are posted on the box, which contains the range sign-in register, as well as above the range entry card reader. For November 2007, starting time is 10:00 AM daily and ending time is 5:00 PM, unless some activity has preempted the range (see "UPCOMING EVENTS AFFECTING RANGE AVAILABILITY" below).

REMINDERS

Replace Pistol Target Backers only when there is absolutely nothing on which to staple a new target. A good rule of thumb is if you can easily remove the wooden target backer and fold it in half, you should replace it.

Plywood Donations: Your donations of plywood for use as target backers on the rifle and pistol ranges are always welcome. For backers, the plywood should be 1/2 inch or thicker and either pre-cut or capable of being cut into pieces 2'x2' (pistol range) or 2'x4' (rifle range). Please help keep the WAC looking good by dropping off your donations by the sliding door on the back side of the green equipment shed; that is, at the side nearest the chapter house. Thanks

Rifle and Pistol Range Rules: The rules governing Rifle and Pistol Range safety, conduct, permissible firearms, and violation policy are posted at the covered pistol range, the covered rifle range, the notice board between the pistol ranges, the notice board at the path leading to the covered rifle range, on the chapter WEB site (damascusiwla.org) and in MS Word format from me via email, when requested. Sometimes questions come up. Though our bylaws indicate that you can call any Board of Directors member about these rules, you will be better served to start with the folks closest to them, i.e., range orientation instructors or the committee chair.
