An open letter to Izaak Walton League Membership:

Recently, my wife and two friends of ours attended the Wild Game Dinner and auction at the IWLA. Everyone enjoyed the food, friendly atmosphere, and fun of the auction. During dinner, my wife asked me why the dinner was being served on Styrofoam plates. After all, isn't this a conservation league? Then, some gentleman in the crowded room remarked, "No one comes here for the conservation. They only come for the shooting range." I was very embarrassed to say the least. As I began to look around the room, I did notice the recycle bin for

aluminum cans, but my eyes quickly diverted to a man dropping the empty glass beverage container into the trash can.

The next week I walked down to the rifle and pistol ranges and noticed a few things I'd never noticed before. There were trash cans at each of the ranges, yet someone still neglected to put their Snickers candy bar wrapper in the can. Upon further examination of the contents of the trash cans, I discovered plastic water bottles, aluminum cans, paper and cardboard boxes, loads of shotgun hulls and rifle brass, and a .22 caliber misfire. Misfires should never be in the trash cans. Everyone here knows better.

The plastic water bottles, aluminum cans, and cardboard boxes that are ending up in the trash need to be addressed. Recycling containers are available (although not always clearly marked) and need to be used. These are easy steps we already do at home (If you live in Montgomery County it's mandatory). As members of a conservation league who are committed to preserving the environment, shouldn't we also make an effort to recycle at the club? Maybe more containers are needed and better signs are required.

Rifle brass and shotgun hulls that litter the ground around the ranges are another matter which also needs to be addressed. We have such a nice facility, yet it looks like our members are just too lazy to clean up after themselves. Empty Brass MUST go into the 5 gallon buckets and later is sorted for steel and aluminum. These are all recyclable and are worth money to our club yet we throw them away. The signs at the range need to updated and remind folks it is MANDATORY to clean up after themselves. Yes, pick up the brass your rifle has hurled three lanes down. Yes, put your diet coke can in the recycle bin. Yes, leave the range cleaner than you found it. Just because your pistol flings empties off into the grass doesn't mean you aren't responsible for picking it up.

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

The first two conservation events of the year, the Nestbox and Rain Barrel Workshops, went off without a hitch.

This year we tried something different and ran the Nestbox Workshop for our Scouts. Twelve Boy Scouts and twelve Webelos plus some of the adults participated in the workshop. This was a marked improvement from the last two years when we had only four or five participants. Thanks go to Jim Piateski for running the workshop, and Bill Ladd who made the Nestbox kits previously.

The Rain Barrel Workshop is always a popular event and usually plays to a full house. The number of participants is limited due to the limited materials we have on hand to make the barrels and space in the meeting room. We advertise this event to our members and the local community and usually get a large number of participants that are not members of the chapter and this year was no exception. About half the participants were non-members and the diverse areas they came from beyond Damascus (Silver Spring, Poolesville, Finksburg, and Thurmont) is a good indication of the broad impact of this event. When one person called to reserve a space they asked about additional space and had their neighbor call right after them – it seems they had been trying, unsuccessfully, to register for a rain barrel workshop for the last two years and were very grateful to get into our workshop. The success of the workshop is because of a team effort. A team lead by Bill Gazdik and including Bill Ladd, Susan Bortniak, and Mark Grygo, prepared the barrels for the workshop. Some of these same folks also helped out on the night of the workshop where Meo Curtis and Jeff Deschamps did a tag-team presentation.

The WAC Legislative Affairs Committee has received information that the Montgomery County Delegation is sponsoring an Anti-Trapping Bill, HB 0931 in the current session of the Maryland General Assembly and has determined that the issues contained in this Bill may be of interest to some of our members. ADULT AIRGUN PROGRAM

We have an active airgun program for adults at the WAC-IWLA. On Monday evenings from 6:30 PM till about 8:30 PM indoor 10 meter air pistol and air rifle firing is conducted in the downstairs range. This is informal shooting in a supervised manner. We generally fire a 60 round match for the air pistol. Those wishing to fire air rifles can do it at the same time as the pistol firing. We have some air pistols that new shooters can use if you want to get started in this fun activity. The outdoor airgun range is available for your use during normal range hours. That range has a covered firing line with benches where you can fire at targets from 10 yards to 50 yards. There are target frames for holding paper targets and a number of different types of metal 'reactive' targets are kept displayed for your use. Swinging cans and several 'field targets' are also available for your use. You might want to purchase some Daisy Shatter-Blast breakable targets and bring them along with you to use there. A number of air rifle field target matches are scheduled during the year. These are listed in the chapter calendar. 
