SPRING CLEAN-UP (Meo Curtis)

The Chapter's Spring Patuxent Watershed Clean Up took place on Saturday April 4 this year, same day as the region-wide Patuxent and Potomac River clean ups. There were 37 members, family, and friends who came out to tackle trash on our roads and streamsides and a couple of dump sites on state parkland. Ranger Chris Czarra assisted us with his DNR pick up and by having scouted out the two big dump sites. Michelle Chesnut served as the 'rover' to keep folks supplied with trash bags and water, and also as our camera crew.

The hardworking folks picked up about 41 bags of trash, seven tires including two truck tires, 5 sheets of plywood and other miscellaneous home remodeling debris, bedframe, putty buckets, a variety of car parts including fenders, bumpers, and running boards, and lots of very odds and ends. Each bag of trash weighs from 20 to 25 pounds, so we picked up from 800 to 900 pounds of bagged trash. Most of the bagged materials were recyclable beverage containers--plastic and glass bottles and aluminum cans.

One new member commented that this was the first time he had done an outdoor activity and didn't want a beer afterwards. However, he did enjoy the terrific lunch created for all participants by member Jose Scoseria.

Thanks again to all the folks who came out and helped, in particular to those who loaned their vehicles to move trash back to the collection site.

INVASIVE PLANT WORKSHOP (Meo Curtis)

Despite the blustery and rainy outlook, 15 members and family came out for the workshop on how to manage non-native invasive plants that are taking over our yards and public lands. They learned about identification

and control strategies using the Montgomery County's Weed Warrior approach and then went out on the Chapter property to put their new knowledge to use.

They cut back and pulled out Japanese honeysuckle, bush honeysuckle, bittersweet, autumn olive, and garlic mustard. All of these except garlic mustard are perennials so tackling them several years in a row before they really start growing is necessary for successful management. Due to the wet conditions, we could not apply systemic herbicide to the newly-cut surfaces--this decreases the amount of time needed for control.

In the area of pines and small hardwoods by the access road, two years work have resulted in a considerable decrease in the heavy vining material that was climbing up into the trees and weighing them down. Other shrubby invasives have also been removed. However, because of the amount of invasives on the Chapter and adjacent properties, there will need to be continued management in areas where we would like to promote native trees and shrubs that provide habitat and food for birds, butterflies, and other wildlife.

Thanks to those who came out and didn't mind getting a little wet and muddy while tackling the 'sinewy seven' and 'flowering four'.
