AIRGUN (Phil Dean) AAFTA NATIONAL MATCH HELD AT WAC-IWLA

The 2010 National Match of the American Airgun Field Target Association (AAFTA) was held at the outdoor airgun range of the WAC-IWLA on October 15, 16, and 17. There were 85 participants representing 21 different states, Canada, and Wales who fired in this air rife field target competition. There were two shooting lines set up in the woods beyond the airgun range each with 15 lanes. Each lane had two field targets placed on it at distances from 10 yards to 55 yards and shooters fired two shots at each target for a total of 60 shots per line. Contestants fired on both lines during the two days of competition. There was also a field target air pistol competition.

A very big "thank you" is extended to all those volunteers who assisted in setting up the range, coordinated the registration and check-in, assisted with the food service, took care of the daily activities, and helped with the tearing down after the match. Joe McDaniel was the match director and is to be commended for an excellent job of planning, advertising, and coordinating this national level event.
