If you like, bring your shotguns so you can shoot afterwards, when the shotgun ranges open at noon.

Members who have not completed this course must always shoot on the shotgun ranges with the supervision of a member who has completed the course. This is the same policy as the rifle and pistol ranges.

Pre-Registration is not necessary.

Think Green: e-subscriptions

Montgomery County

There is a very easy and free way to get electronic newsletters, updates, and information of all sorts of Montgomery County government activities. You can subscribe to one or more e-subscriptions through the County's web site and have information delivered via your e-mail address. The e-mail address for subscription is:

https://ext01.montgomerycountymd.gov/entp/s1p/esubpublic/newsubscriber.do

The County does not use your e-mail address for anything other than those specific subscriptions to which you subscribe. A number of agencies provide routine information through these e-subscriptions, including consumer protection, council and executive updates, permitting services, and of course, my personal favorite, environmental protection. For the best overview on County activities, I recommend that you subscribe to the Public Information Office e-gazettes, in particular the Paperless Airplane.

Howard County

I couldn't find similar e-subscription services, but there is a terrific web page with all sorts of links to 'green' services in Howard County. This is the Green Central Station through the Office of Environmental Sustainability: <u>http://livegreenhoward.com/</u>

The site includes a calendar of events, a map of featured 'green' hotspots and amenities, a featured 'Green Business', and even a blog for posting your own information of note.

Frederick County

Frederick County also has its own Office of Sustainability and Environmental Resources to 'advance practical solutions for protecting the environment, conserving energy and living sustainability.' Services include a quarterly electronic newsletter on local activities and news of note. http://www.frederickcountymd.gov/index.aspx?NID=3530
