Izaak Walton League of America Celebrates 90th Anniversary (Greg Talamini)

In 1922, fifty-four visionary sportsmen met in Chicago to discuss an issue of common concern: the deterioration of America's top fishing streams. Uncontrolled industrial discharge, raw sewage and soil erosion threatened many of the nation's most productive waterways. At the same time, critical wildlife habitat was being destroyed across the country and the nation's forests and wilderness areas were quickly disappearing.

Moving forward fifteen years some of our local area citizens began what has become one of our country's leading IWLA chapters, The Wildlife Achievement Chapter. Yes, our chapter is celebrating our 75th anniversary.

The WAC was founded in 1937. It had no real property at that time. Where they met up to 1942 is unknown. In 1942 WAC leased land on Briggs Chaney road near Colesville ,MD. In 1969-1971 WAC moved to the Damascus area. In 1971 the chapter house, skeet and trap fields were built on the Damascus property.

In 1971 Mr. Malcolm King from Maryland Fish and Wildlife began a program to clean local streams. This eventually became the Save Our Streams Program. Mr. King was member of both WAC and the Rockville chapter. He worked with both chapters organizing regular cleanups of the Patuxent River and water courses in Montgomery, Howard and Frederick counties. Eventually the Save Our Streams Program was adopted throughout MD and then across the U. S. WAC support of the Save Our Streams Program in its infancy, especially for the Patuxent River water shed, was a contributing factor to that program becoming a national conservation effort. Our chapter continues to support our community by offering water shed cleanup programs, hunter safety education classes, invasive plant information and rain barrel classes and more. We members of WAC continue to work in these areas providing our children and future Ikes a legacy to be proud of.

Learn more about protecting local resources

Howard County—Wednesdays February 15 and 22

Learn how to manage small lots with woods to improve wildlife habitat and water quality. Come to the 'Woods in Your Backyard workshop ' at the Howard County Conservancy. This is a two-session course on Wednesdays, February 15 and 22 from 6:30 pm - 9:00 pm, taught at The Gudelsky Center, 10520 Old Frederick Road, Woodstock, MD. Workshop cost is \$20.00 per individual; \$30 per couple from same household. The Workshop is sponsored by the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay's Forestry for the Bay; the Howard County Conservancy; and the Maryland DNR Forest Service.

Small lots, such as the one you may own, are a big deal. The vast majority of landowners in Maryland have less than 10 acres. By enhancing wooded areas or creating natural areas on your lot, you can enjoy recreation, aesthetics, wildlife and improved water quality. Owners of even just a few acres can make a positive difference in their environment through planning and implementing simple stewardship practices learned at this workshop.
