Success at Tree Planting and Maintenance Sunday March 18

About 15 volunteers showed up for work at the Pig Tail Area on WSSC property. For those unfamiliar with the Pigtail area it is on the Howard County side of Triadelphia Reservoir. About a dozen years ago, our chapter planted native trees in this area as part of a WSSC reforestation project. There were a mix of Chapter and non-Chapter, young and old volunteers. One group dug holes and then planted and watered more than 100 small shrubs and trees, including hazelnuts, elderberry, and pecans. Another group cut wire fencing to length and then protected the new plantings from deer browse and rub with wire cages secured with rebar. A few others pulled vines and other invasives from around trees that had been planted on previous work days. The Chapter will continue to work in partnership with WSSC and other volunteer groups to help maintain this area until the trees grow tall enough to fend for themselves. We plan for another work day here in the fall. Special thanks to Jim Piateski for obtaining and transporting the fencing, the rebar, and the chain saw.

Upper Patuxent Watershed Clean Up Saturday March 31

Our Chapter continued its 30-year plus trend with our Annual Spring Watershed Clean Up/Adopt A Road on Saturday March 31, 2012. There were about 30 volunteers so we were able to pick up not only our Adopt-A-Road stretch along Mullinix Mill Road, but also Long Corner Road from the Patuxent River to Rte. 108; Annapolis Rock Road from the River to Rte. 108; Howard Chapel Road from the River to Rte. 108/Rte. 650; and Gue Road where one of the Patuxent tributary crosses all the way to Long Corner Rd. Some volunteers walked and picked up along the tributary at Gue Road and the Patuxent River at Long Corner, Annapolis Rock, and Mullinix Mill. At least one of the volunteers from Trout Unlimited brought his waders and picked up trash while walking in the Patuxent River. At Gue Road, the volunteer crew was led by a nearby resident who saw our event announcement and came out to help clean up this area where she regularly walks and regularly picks up litter.

We collected about 50 contractor bags of trash. Most of the trash was recyclable beverage containers, along with one tire, various amounts of household remodeling materials, and a wedding dress.

The Chapter continued its tradition of providing lunch for all volunteers. We also gave each participant a metal water bottle and reusable sturdy plastic bag with our Chapter logo to support the 'reduce, reuse, and recycle' approach to conserving our natural resources.

Many thanks to Jose Scoseria, our chef, and Don Hunt for lunch support; Judy Riley and Jeff Deschamps, our rovers to keep our volunteer crews supplied with water and trash bags and relocation to maintain work flow; Jim Piateski, who volunteered his time and his truck for trash hauling; and also to Alan Zlotkowski from DNR who came with a truck to help haul out trash.
