<u>RIFLE AND PISTOL / RANGE SAFETY OFFICER (RSO) UPDATE</u> (Jesse-Thomas Lim) <u>Important! It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND KNOW ALL WAC Rifle/Pistol range</u> <u>safety, conduct and rules!</u>

"Important Reminder! If you are in doubt, ask a question. That whole thing about better to beg for forgiveness than ask permission doesn't apply with guns. If there is doubt in use of our rifle and pistol ranges, if there is a misunderstanding, PLEASE ask the Rifle and pistol chairman or designated WAC Range Safety Office with an orange RSO badge". The WAC RSO Committee would like to highlight the following safety rule:

Safety rule 17. Firearms which are not in use shall be stored appropriately behind the shooting position. Firearms stored in the range racks shall be unloaded with action open, chamber empty, magazine removed, and safety on if available.

This means the shooter may only have one firearm on the shooting line at a time. All others are to appropriately store behind the shooting position.

Additional safe gun handling rules that should ALWAYS be practiced every time one is shooting:

Watch where you point the muzzle of the FIREARM (muzzle control). Control the direction of your firearm's muzzle <u>at all times</u> by pointing it in a safe direction. This means:

- Always keep the firearm's muzzle pointed in a safe direction. A "safe direction" means that the gun is pointed so that even if an accidental discharge occurred, it would NOT result in injury. Pointed downrange at all time and muzzle-up when removing from bench for proper storage.
- Always keep your finger off the trigger until you actually intend to shoot. When handling a gun, rest your finger outside the trigger guard or along the side of the gun. Don't touch the trigger until you are actually ready to fire.
- Firearms should be unloaded when not actually in use. Whenever you pick up a gun, such as when removing it from or returning it to storage, remember to point it in a safe direction and make sure it is unloaded.
- Be sure you know how your firearm operates: read the manual on your firearm, know how to safely open and close the action of the firearm and know how to safely remove any ammunition from the firearm and its magazine.
- Know your target and what's beyond it.

CONDUCT Rule# 18. We will conduct a strict audit and observe any member using the rifle and pistol ranges for prohibited training and certification activity outside of the WAC sanctioned training programs.

• **<u>Rule# 18.</u>** No member may use our ranges for commercial training purposes. Using any WAC firearms range for financial gain, personal or otherwise, jeopardizes our charitable organization status and is a major conduct violation of our range rules. Anyone found to be in violation of this rule will have his or her range privileges suspended pending investigation by the Rifle and Pistol Range Safety Officer Committee, which will present its findings to the Board of Directors for their action.

If at any time observed or you are approached by anyone at WAC for individual training for a fee on our rifle or pistol ranges, have any questions about the R/P rules, concerns about member conduct on the R/P ranges, do not hesitate to contact Jesse Lim.

Range's Tipper Corner: REMINDER: NO RIFLE CARTRIDGES ALLOWED at all time on our pistol ranges (covered or uncovered) Firearm's rules highlight:

Firearms Rule #6. Handguns in traditional center fire rifle calibers must be shot on the rifle range. Other handguns are prohibited on the rifle range, except when firing at targets beyond 50 yards.

Firearms Rule #8. All handguns with handgun caliber ammunition are permitted on the covered and uncovered pistol ranges.

A: Pistol-caliber carbines (long guns firing handgun ammunition) are permitted on the covered pistol range, uncovered pistol range and rifle range.

B: Acceptable ammunition calibers include: all rim fire, 30 M1 Carbine, .32 ACP, .327, 357 Magnum, 38 Special, .380, 9mm Luger, 40 S&W, 10mm, 44 Special, 44 Magnum, 44-40 Winchester, 45 ACP, 45 Colt, 5.7, and .460/ .500 (S&W). If you do not see the caliber listed, please contact the Rifle and Pistol Chairperson.

C: All rifles and rifle carbines are allowed on the rifle range as well as shotguns firing solid slugs.

D: Handguns may only be fired at the 75 and 100 yard targets on the rifle range.

IWLA WAC NRA Basic Pistol Training Class Update - Wendy Smith

The next offering of the NRA Basic Pistol training class will be September 19 and October, 11, 2015. This is a two day class, students must attend the first class as a pre-requisite to the October 11th class.

A special WAC email announcement will be sent announcing the registration on/about September 8th. Preregistrations cannot be accommodated at this time. Registration is for WAC members (and their family members per WAC membership rules). Minors (age 12 and up) must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian the entire time. The cost of the course is \$50.00 per student payable the first day of class and includes the Maryland HQL Training portion for qualified recipients.

Our final NRA Basic Pistol class of the year will be the 7th Annual Ladies/Daughters/Teens dinner and class on October 17th and November 8th, 2015. More information will be coming in the September newsletter. Registration requirements are the same as above and will be announced in early October.

WALK-INS TO THE NRA CLASSES ARE NOT PERMITTED AT ANY TIME, due to NRA registration requirements.

Students must register in advance once registration is opened, as materials are ordered specifically for the class size and for student-to-instructor ratios. Classes fill up fast, don't delay registration if you are committed to taking the class. As well, we do ask that registrants kindly honor their commitment to both days of the class, as often times we have to turn away people on the wait-list and cannot fill their spots on short notice.
