Be Prepared: 2016 Membership Dues Renewal Process Starting Soon

The motto of the Boy Scouts of America "Be Prepared" comes to mind as the IWLA Wildlife Achievement Chapter prepares to begin processing membership renewals for 2016. Membership dues are paid annually on a calendar year basis. Chapter leadership is taking steps to prepare for this critical activity and asks you to do the same.

Here is what the chapter is doing:

- We are investigating ways to modernize and streamline this process so it can be done faster and easier with less paper and expense.
- We will send as many renewal notices as possible via email to reduce postage costs and consume less paper.
- We will send paper-based renewal forms in the mid-September timeframe for those that do not receive an email-based notice.

Here is what you are asked to do:

- Notify us right away with your current email address, phone number(s) and street address if this information has changed within the past 12 months.
- Add the email address membership@iwlawac.org to your list of safe (or approved) senders so related messages do not get filtered out as spam mail.
- Send a check or money order right away (payable to IWLA) for the full amount due to the address listed on the renewal. Partial payments will not be accepted and returned.
- Complete the terms of your probation by performing any remaining work requirements before the end year of your second membership year is finished. Opportunities for conservation work credits diminish near the end of the calendar year so do not delay.

Probationary Work Requirements for Members with Limited Abilities

All members, regardless of physical abilities, are required to complete two work projects per year for the first two years of their membership in order to fulfill the terms of their probation. At least one of these projects, each year, must be conservation oriented. Chapter leadership will provide opportunities for members to make a contribution during work projects that require physical labor (i.e., range maintenance). Tasks can be assigned that require minimal or no physical labor.

Each work project listed on the chapter's web site includes a point of contact and that person's name, email address and phone number. Members with limited abilities should contact this person ahead of the event to discuss the nature of the event and determine what work they can perform.

You are urged to legibly complete the sign in sheet made available for each work project. Likewise, you should check the chapter newsletter in the following month to ensure you receive credit for your service.

2016 IWLA WAC Range Access Cards and Membership Cards

In order to get 2016 Range Access Cards to members sooner than later, they are being issued as soon as possible after receiving renewal payments. Members no longer have to wait the approximately 4-6 weeks after receipt of payment while IWLA National completes processing of your renewal and creates your membership card. This change in process also means you will not receive your 2016 membership card in the mail as this would incur substantial additional processing delays and postage costs.

Members will be able to get their 2016 membership cards at the chapter house after January 1st. Note that your membership card is NOT required for any chapter-related activity. It is mainly a piece of wallet filler for most members. Please let me know if you wish to arrange to get your membership card.

National Hunting and Fishing Day

The fourth Saturday in September is National Hunting and Fishing Day. Congress established this day in 1972 to honor hunters and anglers for their leadership in conserving America's wildlife and wild places. Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

This is the 9th National Prescription Drug Take Back Day, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Justice (www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov/drug_disposal/takeback/) At this site, you can find a link by zip code to find the closest disposal site.

The goal is to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications. A number of recent research studies have shown the presence of prescription drugs or their byproducts in our local streams and rivers. This is the result of disposal by flushing them down the toilet but they're not being eliminated through our wastewater treatment systems. Keep in mind that these compounds will come back to us in public water supplies since they do not have regulated standards for drinking water. So, participate and encourage your neighbors to participate.

Upcoming conservation project

September 12 at Rachel Carson Conservation Park

We'll meet at Rachel Carson Conservation Park off of Sundown Road outside Laytonsville no later than 9:00 AM

We'll be planting trees and maintaining previously planted trees doing cage repair and weeding as needed.

Official address is 5610 Sundown Road, Gaithersburg MD for the GPS. Heading east out of Laytonsville the location will be on the right about 1/4 mile before Zion Road. If you hit Zion Road you have gone to far and need to turn around. If you are coming in from route 650, Damascus Road, then we will be just past Zion Road on the left hand side. Look for the huge American Flag on the flagpole about 100 yards off of the main road, Turn off of Sundown onto the gravel road here and we will be parking in the field to the left once our Parks Department contact arrives to open the gate into this field around 8:45 AM.

This is a rain or shine event so be prepared. Dress in clothes that can get dirty: long pants and tee shirt are fine. Bug spray is always an option for tick concerns.

There will be gloves and tools as well as drinking water but if you have a favorite pair of work gloves, bring them.

We hope to have 3 dozen new trees to plant along the Hawlings River. IWLA will supply pruners, loppers, rakes, shovels. Again, if you have a favorite pair of pruners, feel free to bring them along.

IWLA WAC NRA Basic Pistol Training Class Update – Wendy Smith

The next offering of the NRA Basic Pistol training class will be September 19 and October, 11, 2015. This is a two day class, students must attend the first class as a pre-requisite to the October 11th class.

A special WAC email announcement will be sent announcing the registration on/about September 8th. Pre-registrations cannot be accommodated at this time. Registration is for WAC members (and their family members per WAC membership rules). Minors (age 12 and up) must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian the entire time. The cost of the course is \$50.00 per student payable the first day of class via check payable to IWLA WAC and includes the Maryland HQL Training portion for qualified recipients.

Our final NRA Basic Pistol class of the year will be the 7th Annual Ladies/Daughters/Teens dinner and class on October 17th and November 8th, 2015. More information will be coming in the September newsletter. Registration requirements are the same as above and will be announced in early October.

WALK-INS TO THE NRA CLASSES ARE NOT PERMITTED AT ANY TIME, due to NRA registration requirements.

Students must register in advance once registration is opened, as materials are ordered specifically for the class size and for student-to-instructor ratios. Classes fill up fast, don't delay registration if you are committed to taking the class. As well, we do ask that registrants kindly honor their commitment to both days of the class, as often times we have to turn away people on the wait-list and cannot fill their spots on short notice.
