# 2016 IWLA WAC Range Access Cards and Membership Cards

### (rerun)

In order to get 2016 Range Access Cards to members sooner than later, they are being mailed as soon as possible after receiving renewal payments. Members no longer have to wait the approximately 4-6 weeks after receipt of payment while IWLA National completes processing of your renewal and creates your membership card. This change in process also means you will not receive your 2016 membership card in the mail as this would incur substantial additional processing delays and postage costs.

Members who pay their dues by November 15<sup>th</sup> will be able to get their 2016 membership cards at the chapter house on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Note that your membership card is NOT required for any chapter-related activity. It is mainly a piece of wallet filler for most members. Please let me know if you wish to arrange to get your membership card. Disregard this message if you already made arrangements to get it.

# WAC Range Safety Officer Committee, Rifle and Pistol (Jesse Lim)

Important! It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND KNOW ALL WAC Rifle/Pistol range safety, conduct and rules! They are available on our website and posted at the ranges as well.

If you have any questions, please contact Jesse Lim via cell at 240-832-0354. REMINDER! All WAC members and guests using our rifle / pistol ranges, must strictly sign in on the logbook located at the WAC main building PRIOR to proceeding to the ranges. The logbook box is on the lower level of the chapter house brick wall next to the emergency phone.

Guests must be signed in with their full first and last name, and members are limited to bringing 2 guests per day. Additional guests are NOT permitted, even if they are not shooting or just observing. IMPORTANT: When you are finished using the range, you are responsible for cleaning up the range, and signing yourself out and any guest(s) in the logbook.

Here is an excerpt of the applicable Conduct Rules referenced above:

3. Only range-approved members and their guests are permitted to shoot on the rifle and pistol ranges.

4. A member's current range-approved membership card must be visibly displayed on his/her person while using the ranges.

5. Range-approved members shall challenge all shooters not displaying a valid range-approved membership card.

6. All members and guests using the rifle and pistol ranges must sign the range register before proceeding to the ranges, and sign out on the same register before leaving the Chapter grounds.

7. A member may bring a maximum of two guests to the rifle and pistol ranges per day, and must remain with his/her guests at all times

RSO Tippers: Proper firearm shooter's guide on using the shooting bench's wood block-rest with sand bag or without sand bag.

When using a wood block-rest with sandbag or without sandbag wood block-rest for rifle or pistol, added a new scope to one or are trying to determine the best bullet for your rifle, what is one of the most important factors in this equation? For those of you that are thinking, holding the gun perfectly still while shooting, are correct and IMPORTANT, extending the muzzle extended approximately 6-8 inches away pointing down range from the wood block-rest

When shooting a rifle, load, or zeroing a new scope, always place the long gun on a rest while performing the test. The reason for this is to be sure you are holding the gun as still as you can. Improper uses of our wood block-rest will have a costly damage.





# Calling Hot Range:

Let's say you go to an indoor range with some sort of automatic target system - the firing line is all established and you go through the doors and into the range. The range is almost always "hot" as people are shooting their own pace. All gun handling is done on the bench of the firing line and you can start shooting whenever you are ready.

### Calling Cold Range:

Same scenario but the range is indoor or outdoor but they don't have an automatic target placement system. Meaning you have to go post your targets out in the bay. So, in order to keep everyone safe to do this the range goes "cold" meaning typically all firearms are unloaded and placed on the bench with the action open (no magazine in the gun either) and everyone steps away from their firearm. Once it's established everyone is "cold" everyone goes and places their targets out and once everyone returns the range returns to a "hot" condition (meaning you can commence shooting).
