Other Conservation Activities:

Speaker: National Bobwhite Conservation Initiative

At the July 27 general membership meeting, Tom Franklin from the National Bobwhite Conservation Initiative (NBCI) will be talking about efforts to increase bobwhite populations. The bird has declined by 80% across its range during the last 40 years due to habitat change on the rural landscape. The NBCI is working with 25 state fish and wildlife agencies trying hard to reverse the decline and they are having success in some areas.

Many of us grew up in areas where you heard bobwhite calls every summer. While there likely aren't any bobwhite calls there now, there are lots more buildings and roads. It's not just about bobwhites either—the habitat they need supports a wide variety of native plants and other wildlife. More information is available at: http://bringbackbobwhites.org/

<u>Free Rain Barrel Workshops</u> Alpha Ridge Landfill, 2350 Marriottsville Rd, Marriottsville, MD 21104

The Howard County Master Gardeners distribute rain barrels and teach people how to use them. Howard County residents are eligible to receive a free 55-gal barrel with cut-outs for fittings, to be used for a rain barrel (one barrel per address, please).

The rain barrel must be used in Howard County and the recipient of the barrel must fill out a pledge form and take part in the workshop. After the workshop, the recipient will know where to buy the parts and how to assemble and maintain the rain barrel.

WAC Range Safety Officer Committee, Rifle and Pistol (Jesse Lim and Wendy Smith)

Important! It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND KNOW ALL WAC Rifle/Pistol range safety, conduct and rules! They are available on our website and posted at the ranges as well.

If you have any questions, please contact Jesse Lim via cell at 240-832-0354. REMINDER! All WAC members and guests using our rifle / pistol ranges, must strictly sign in on the logbook located at the WAC main building PRIOR to proceeding to the ranges. The logbook box is on the lower level of the chapter house brick wall next to the emergency phone.

Important! All guests must sign in and be accompanied by a current member while on club grounds. Guest name not sign in will be removing immediately from the club ground and consider as trespassing.

WAC board has approved the request from the chairman of the rifle and pistol to implement and add in our conduct rules for "Guest Identification Badges" guideline rules will be included in the 2017 renewals membership and new member.

Guests must be signed in with their full first and last name, and members are limited to **bringing 2 guests per day.** Additional guests are NOT permitted, even if they are not shooting or just

observing. IMPORTANT: When you are finished using the range, you are responsible for cleaning up the range, and signing yourself out and any guest(s) in the logbook.

Here is an excerpt of the applicable Conduct Rules referenced above:

- 3. Only range-approved members and their guests are permitted to shoot on the rifle and pistol ranges.
- 4. A member's current range-approved membership card must be visibly displayed on his/her person while using the ranges.
- 5. Range-approved members shall challenge all shooters not displaying a valid range-approved membership card.
- 6. All members and guests using the rifle and pistol ranges must sign the range register before proceeding to the ranges, and sign out on the same register before leaving the Chapter grounds.
- 7. A member may bring a maximum of two guests to the rifle and pistol ranges per day, and must remain with his/her guests at all times
