

You must complete two events in each of the first two years of your membership. At least one of these events each year must be a conservation event. Please read the section at the end of the newsletter about determining your status if you are in doubt as to your situation.

Membership Approves Dues Increase for 2017

IWLA Wildlife Achievement Chapter (WAC) members approved a membership dues increase at the August 24th membership meeting. The proposed increase goes into effect for the 2017 membership year. IWLA WAC members will see the following changes in rates to renew their membership:

- Individual member dues would increase from \$135 to \$145.
- Family member dues would increase from \$205 to \$220.
- Student member dues would increase from \$40 to \$45.
- Youth member dues would increase from \$30 to \$32.

Your overall membership dues include support for our Chapter, the Maryland State Division, and the National organization. Those with a lifetime membership to the IWLA National organization will not see any dues increase.

The increase simply represents passing along a rate increase in the National portion of your dues that was approved by delegates attending the National Convention in July. It reflects challenges with IWLA National finances which have suffered from declining revenue for the past five years. National successfully reduced its expenses over the past few years, but needs additional revenue to strengthen the league for the future. It will use the revenue increase to:

- Enhance the visibility of the League at all levels (i.e., local, state, national),
- Add staff to support chapters and members; and,
- Increase advocacy on conservation and outdoor recreation policy.

Updated Contact Information Requested

Membership renewal notices are expected to go out within a few weeks and it is vital your information is current. Probationary members are urged to complete any remaining work requirements before the end year of the second membership year is finished. Opportunities for conservation work credits diminish near the end of the calendar year so do not delay. Probationary Work Requirements for Members with Limited Abilities

All members, regardless of physical abilities, are required to complete two work projects per year for the first two years of their membership in order to fulfill the terms of their probation. At least one of these projects, each year, must be conservation oriented. Chapter leadership will provide opportunities for members to make a contribution during work projects that require physical labor (i.e., range maintenance). Tasks can be assigned that require minimal or no physical labor.

Each work project listed on the chapter's web site includes a point of contact and that person's name, email address and phone number. Members with limited abilities should contact this person ahead of the event to discuss the nature of the event and determine what work they can perform. Opportunities to complete conservation related work projects diminish later in the calendar year, so you are urged to fulfill any related obligations sooner than later.

You need to legibly complete the sign in sheet made available for each work project. Likewise, you should check the chapter newsletter in the following month to ensure you receive credit for your service.

NEW RANGE POLICY Effective January 1, 2017 -- Visitor Badges

Starting on January 1, 2017 WAC members who bring their family and guests to any of the ranges will need them to wear a WAC <u>visitor's badge</u>. Each member that has a 2017 range access card will be provided TWO visitor badges that must be visibly worn at all times by family and other guests. Visitor badges will be distributed with members' 2017 range access cards after receipt of renewal payments. Visitors are only allowed on the ranges when accompanied by



members. Therefore, anybody on the ranges without a 2017 range access card or a visitor's badge will be deemed trespassing and will be requested to leave the property.

Unlike range access cards, the design of visitor badges is permanent will not change each year. Members should retain their visitor badges as long as they remain members. Lost visitor badges will be replaced for a cost of \$10. Visitor badges will be printed with the member's name and ID number. The member must be present with the guests that are using their visitor cards.

Gardens Maintenance Friday September 30.

The butterfly weed which has a bright orange flower is in the milkweed family and is thus a host plant for the larvae of the monarch butterfly. WSSC YOUTH AND WOMEN HUNT DAYS: The Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) is sponsoring hunt days on their property specifically for youth and women. Upcoming days are Saturday November 12 in the T. Howard Duckett (Rocky Gorge) watershed and on Saturday December 3 in the Triadelphia watershed. The hunters will be assigned tree stands. Allowed firearms include shotguns only (no muzzleloaders), rifled slug, or sabot ammunition. All managed hunts end at 11:00 a.m. and hunters must sign out at Brighton Dam regardless of success. *Applications for groups of four or less on the same day will be accepted.* The Deer Hunt application is available directly from Eddie Franceschi, Watershed Manager, at (301) 206-7488 or manageddeerhunts@wsscwater.com.

To participate in the program, all hunters must have the following:

- Valid Maryland hunting license;
- Maryland or other State Hunter Safety Certification. The Certification does not need to be included with application if it was previously submitted to WSSC. *The Pre-1977 exemption is not acceptable for WSSC hunts*.
- Current Maryland or equivalent shooter qualification certificate.
- WSSC Watershed use permit if over 16 and under 65 years of age (\$6 per day or \$70 per year) and
- 2016 WSSC Deer Hunt Application.

WAC Range Safety Officer Committee, Rifle and Pistol October Update –(Jesse Lim)

Important! It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND KNOW ALL WAC Rifle/Pistol range safety, conduct and rules! They are available on our website and posted at the ranges as well. http://www.damascusiwla.org/RiflePistolRules.html If you have any questions, please contact the WAC Rifle and Pistol Chairman, Jesse Lim via cell at 240-832-0354.

REMINDER! All WAC members and guests using our rifle / pistol ranges, must strictly sign in on the logbook located at the WAC main building PRIOR to proceeding to the ranges. The logbook box is on the lower level of the chapter house brick wall next to the emergency phone. Important! All guests must sign in and be accompanied by a current member while on club grounds. Guest not signing in will be asked to immediately leave the club grounds and considered as trespassing.

Rifle and pistol Chairman / RSO committee will soon implement and update safety and conduct rules regarding "Guest Identification Badges" for the 2017 membership year. The Rifle and Pistol Rules will be updated accordingly and more information will come in advance of the 2017 membership year.

Guests must be signed in with their full first and last name, and members are limited to bringing 2 guests per day. Additional guests are NOT permitted, even if they are not shooting or just observing. IMPORTANT: When you are finished using the range, you are responsible for cleaning up the range, and signing yourself out and any guest(s) in the logbook.

Safety warning:

Shooting steel targets is restricted at WAC to specialized events (cowboy shoots, bowling pin shoots or practical defense) and/or per the safety requirements listed below. Even then, shooting at steel targets carries the risk of ricochet or lead-splatter.

Please refer to the following sections of the Rifle and Pistol Safety Rules:

- 11. Permissible free standing targets include, commercially made steel or "self-sealing" plastic targets which swing, spin, or fall when hit by a bullet.
 - A. Explosive targets (e.g., Tannerite) are strictly prohibited.
- 12. Homemade target frames and metal targets must be approved by the Rifle/Pistol Committee Chairman or a designated representative before use on the Chapter ranges.
- 13. The target being fired upon must be directly in front of the firing point. Shooters must ensure that only one target is in the line of fire. Each shot must be discharged in a controlled manner so as to ensure that it hits the target and no bullets leave the range area.
- 14. Steel targets must be placed at least 25 yards from the firing line and directly in front of the earth bank backstops.
- 15. Only unjacketed lead or frangible bullets in the correct caliber for the target are permitted for use on steel targets. Any WAC shooter violating the any posted warning, safety and conduct rules AT A MINIMUM will receive a citation, have their range card suspended pending an investigation and required to re-attend the range orientation class.

All WAC Range-approved members are Range Officers and are responsible for being aware of and reporting any range conduct/safety violations to the Rifle and Pistol Chairman email to alphashooter@usa.com.

Please also utilize your self-awareness at any point in time relative to Maryland's gun possession laws and restrictions. Please report any suspicious activity to the Rifle and Pistol Chairman.

Subject to some exceptions, possession of "assault weapons" is generally prohibited in Maryland. Additionally, Maryland's prohibited person categories for possession of firearms are more extensive than federal law.

Possession of a firearm or ammunition is prohibited by any person who:

Has been convicted of a disqualifying crime; Has been convicted of a violation classified as a common law crime and received a term of imprisonment of more than 2 years; Is a fugitive from justice; Is a habitual drunkard; Is addicted to a controlled substance or is a habitual user; Suffers from a mental disorder and has a history of violent behavior against himself or another person; Has been found incompetent to stand trial; Has been found not criminally responsible; Has been voluntarily admitted for more than 30 consecutive days to a facility for a mental disorder; Has been involuntarily committed to a facility for a mental disorder; Is under the protection of court appointed guardian, unless the guardian was appointed solely for a physical disability; Is a respondent against whom a current non ex parte protective order has been entered under; or Is 30 years old or younger and has been adjudicated delinquent by a juvenile court for an act that would be a disqualifying crime if committed by an adult.

A person who moves into the state must have all handguns and "assault weapons" registered with the Secretary within 90 days after establishing residency. A person who is subject to a firearms disqualification as a result of an adjudication or commitment that occurred in the state MAY be authorized to possess a firearm if: the person is not subject to another firearms restriction, the Health Department (in accordance with this section) determines that the person MAY possess a firearm, a person who seeks relief from a firearms disqualification shall file an application with the Health Department in the form and manner set by the Health Department. Range oriented members:

Judging from the number of members that are in these groups I think there is some confusion as to what a Probationary year is.
