Reforestation at Brookeville-Reddy Branch May 5

We had another great day at our Brookeville-Reddy Branch site. The Reddy Branch is a tributary to the Hawlings River, which flows to the Rocky Gorge drinking water reservoir. The weather cooperated – the heatwave ended and the rain held off so it was a perfect time to be outdoors. We mended deer protection cages, installed cages around 'volunteer' native trees, and hacked backed or pulled out vines and other overgrowth on our trees.

Our Chapter has been working on this site for 10 years. For those members that have been with this project since it began, it is great to see the progress that has been made from what had been a pasture next to the stream towards restoring a forested buffer. The first timers were impressed with how tall the growth is along the Reddy Branch. If you have never been to this site, we will return in the fall and you can help out with this long term project and see first-hand what has been accomplished so far.
