CHARLES WILES JR.

Born on November 7, 1928, in Frederick he was the son of the late Charles I. Wiles, Sr. and Gladys Beachley Wiles. He is survived by wife, Leila M. Wiles, daughter, Nancy Wiles, brother Bernard Wiles of Frederick, sister Charlotte Tyeryer of Yorktown, Va. and predeceased by brother Earl Wiles and sister Joyce Cramer. He was raised in Frederick on a farm on West Patrick St., now known as The Golden Mile. The family also farmed the land where Francis Scott Key Mall is now located. Charlie attended Frederick High School where he lettered in baseball all three years. After high school, he was offered a tryout with the then Brooklyn Dodgers and later turned down a contract to play for them. Charlie met Leila while he was at University of Maryland and she was at George Washington University through their association with the Lutheran Student Association. Charlie went on to graduate from the University of Maryland, and he and Leila were married on October 27, 1950 in St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Washington, D. C. He became a Montgomery County school teacher and, later, administrator. During his time as an educator he earned a Master's degree and Ph. D and ended his career in education as Director of Montgomery County's Project Head Start. Charlie was an avid member of the Izaak Walton League of America (IWLA) joining the Wildlife Achievement Chapter in 1957 at age 28 when it was located in Silver Spring. When that area changed from farm land to subdivisions, he played an instrumental role in moving the chapter to its present location near Damascus. When the IWLA national office decided to leave its rental space in Arlington, Va. he took charge of building the new national headquarters on Muddy Branch Rd. in Gaithersburg in 1994 where he maintained an office as Operations Manager. Charlie served in many capacities in the IWLA local and state organizations. He also served a term in 1991 as president of IWLA national organization. Due to that position and his many conservation and fund raising efforts he was well known nationally. Charlie was an avid hunter, fisherman and conservationist. Other organizations he belonged to are the NRA and Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. Charlie never lost his interest in farming or working with machine tools. He raised enough beef cattle to share with family and friends for more than 30 years on his place in Clarksburg. He built a machine shop between the barn and house filled with band saws, table saws, drill presses, etc. probably as a reminder to himself of his days as a wood shop teacher at Montgomery Blair High School in the early days of his teaching career as well as to work on projects as needed. Charlie died on June 19, 2018 after a short illness.

A Note to our new members.
