In order for this temporary re-opening to be successful, it is imperative that all members be courteous and respectful to each other. We are all feeling the pinch on our routine activities and will welcome a return to some kind of normalcy.

A note from Jesse Lim

Montgomery County, Maryland declared a catastrophic health emergency on March 5, 2020. To control and prevent the spread of COVID-19 within the state, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Maryland Department of Health recommend canceling large gatherings and urges we employ social distancing in smaller gatherings. We appreciate the Board members and President Rodger Moran for promptly executing a health safety plan to protect our 1300 active members. The Wildlife Achievement Chapter made the decision to temporary close all shooting ranges , rifle, pistol, airgun , archery and all other club activities.

The main purpose was to reduce the threat to human health caused by transmission of the novel corona virus in Maryland, and to protect and save lives. During the temporary closure, we have worked on planning regarding a soft opening of our facility and shooting ranges. Maryland Governor Hogan announced effective as of 7:00 a.m. ET on May 7, 2020, not withstanding anything to the contrary elsewhere in this Order, the following establishments in Maryland may open to the general public: Recreation, outdoor archery and shooting ranges. Thus Wildlife Achievement Chapter was able to immediately apply our action plan as follows

Fellow Ike's,

We will be opening the ranges starting Friday the 8th, with normal hours (10:00 AM to 7:00 PM). Below are "TEMPORARY" rules for all ranges. Please understand that we need to work together and share the ranges while we have the restriction of no guests and a limited number of people allowed on the ranges.

The main club house will remain closed. Use of porta potties (hand sanitizers inside) is required.

All other range rules are still in place.

It is impossible to make any area completely safe. If you are in the high risk category or you have underlying additional health problems, please continue to stay at home.

All of the temporary restrictions listed below will be posted on all ranges.

All other club activities are still on hold. Please refer to the chapter calendar for additional information.

TEMPORARY RANGE RULES EFFECTIVE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

ON ALL RANGES, FACE MASKS ARE REQUIRED
NO GUEST ARE PERMITTED ON ANY RANGES
MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PEOPLE ARE LISTED BY RANGE TYPE
PERSONAL/SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIRED
MAIN CLUBHOUSE IS CLOSED

OUTDOOR AIRGUN RANGE Maximum of 6 people on the range. NO GUESTS

FIELD ARCHERY RANGE Maximum of 3 people NO GUESTS

SHOTGUN FIELDS

Maximum squad size of 5 per field No congregating inside the range house (bathroom, sign in/out and payment only) NO GUESTS

UNCOVERED PISTOL RANGE Maximum of 3 people NO GUESTS

COVERED PISTOL RANGE Maximum of 3 people NO GUESTS

RIFLE RANGE Maximum of 10 people NO GUESTS

If the maximum number of people are on the range, you must wait in the parking area until someone leaves.

If you see someone waiting to shoot, be courteous and let others enjoy the range.

Rifle/Pistol Committee (Hans Varmer)reprint

Are you familiar with Maryland's "Child Access Prevention Law (CAP)"? It states that a person "may not store or leave a loaded firearm in a location where the person knew or should have known that an unsupervised child would gain access to the firearm."

It's something we teach in every NRA Rifle and Pistol Class:

IT IS THE GUN OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT UNAUTHORIZED OR UNTRAINED INDIVIDUALS CANNOT GAIN ACCESS TO HIS OR HER FIREARMS.

If every gun owner in America followed the advice of the NRA and State law we would see a lot less gun violence reported by the media. So please take inventory of your situation. What steps have you taken to prevent unlawful access to your firearms? If you can afford a firearm, you can afford to make it inaccessible to unauthorized people. Please make this a part of your New Year's Resolutions.

RANGE SAFETY (Chuck Crooks) (*This can't be posted enough*)

The club has had security cameras in place for about 6 years. The cameras became necessary after some property thefts and general safety concerns.

Range rules are established for a reason. They are designed to protect the safety of all members, their guests, our neighbors and our property. For these reasons, we take range violations very seriously. No matter how trivial you might think a rule is, there is a basis for safety that must be adhered to.

Recently there has been a series of range rule violations including; shooting from a holster at a non-sanctioned event, failure to display range cards for members and their guests, shooting from the hip, shooting beyond the posted hours, failure to wear safety glasses, failure to write a guests name on the sign in log, using rifle caliber firearms on the pistol ranges and having more than one firearm on the firing line at the same time.

Initial violations (handled by the rifle and pistol committee) can be a warning and/or suspension from the ranges until you retake the range safety course. Serious violations may be reviewed by the board of directors for disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal from the club.

As you know, firearm ranges are always on the radar, especially in our area. Therefore we take our rules and the safety of our members and guests a priority.

As range officers, you are asked to report known violations to the rifle and pistol chairman.
