Interested in Learning More, Renewing Skills, Start a New Hobby?

As I am approaching my time to retire – I have given a lot of thought which direction my life will go. Did I want to expand my knowledge in the environment, refresh my computer skills, or start a new hobby? I have never been one to sit and wait for an opportunity. So, before I retire, I plan to take advantage of an opportunity my current employer provides.

If you are 60+ years old and work less than 20 hours a week – you could be eligible for the Golden ID program with University of Maryland Global Campus (UMGC). This program allows FREE tuition each semester for one or two courses. For an undergraduate three semester hour (sh) course – your cost would be \$45 for technology fees. The tuition cost is zero!

For the environment – you could enroll in NSCI 362 Our Environment: Human Impact and Sustainable Choices.

To Refresh Computer Skills – you could enroll in a one semester hour course - CMST 100B Word Processing, CMST 100D Presentation Graphics (PowerPoint), or CMST 100G Spreadsheet Applications (EXCEL). CMIS 111 Social Networking and Cybersecurity Best Practices is a 3-semester hour course teaching how to protect your virtual self and your social networking accounts.

Art as a hobby – enroll in ARTT 110 Introduction to Drawing or ARTT 152 Basics of Photography.

Golden ID students can receive a Letter Grade, Pass/Fail, or Audit for a course grading method.

Safety First!

The tragic incident on the set of "Rust" reminds us of the dangers that firearms pose when safety rules are taken for granted or treated casually. All of our NRA courses are founded upon the foundations of Knowledge, Skills, and Attitude. But of the three, **Attitude** is the most important. A bad attitude can result in danger, destruction or death despite a wealth of knowledge and skill.

At our club we enjoy a safety record going back decades. But to continue in that vein we will need to double down on our attitude of safety. Just as one incident on a movie set has brought national attention to gun safety and the call for tighter restrictions, one accident on our range could shut us down.

So, I encourage all members who enjoy the shooting sports to renew their dedication to not only the rules of safety but keeping the attitude of safety foremost in mind. Furthermore, I would encourage shooters to attend one of our monthly range orientation classes held near the end of each month to update and remind you of our safety rules and code of conduct.

RANGE SAFETY (Chuck Crooks) (*This can't be posted enough*)

The club has had security cameras in place for about 6 years. The cameras became necessary after some property thefts and general safety concerns.

Range rules are established for a reason. They are designed to protect the safety of all members, their guests, our neighbors and our property. For these reasons, we take range violations very seriously. No matter how trivial you might think a rule is, there is a basis for safety that must be adhered to.

Recently there has been a series of range rule violations including; shooting from a holster at a non-sanctioned event, failure to display range cards for members and their guests, shooting from the hip, shooting beyond the posted hours, failure to wear safety glasses, failure to write a guests name on the sign in log, using rifle caliber firearms on the pistol ranges and having more than one firearm on the firing line at the same time.

Initial violations (handled by the rifle and pistol committee) can be a warning and/or suspension from the ranges until you retake the range safety course. Serious violations may be reviewed by the board of directors for disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal from the club.

As you know, firearm ranges are always on the radar, especially in our area. Therefore we take our rules and the safety of our members and guests a priority.

As range officers, you are asked to report known violations to the rifle and pistol chairman.
