COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING CLINIC (Chuck Crooks)

The next new cowboy shooter clinic, at Damascus, will be on Sunday April 3, 2022. Class size is limited (14 shooting students), and seats are on a first come, first serve basis. Pre-registration is required, no walk ins. Registration deadline is March 28th.

The purpose of the clinics is to introduce the sport to potential enthusiasts who'd like to give it a try without "the whole world watching." Though playing the game under the watchful eye of the Range Officer and their timer is part of the fun, that can be a little intimidating if you're new at it. SAFETY and fun are the real focus of the sport, and we'd like to be sure everyone gets off to the right start. Students will learn how the game is played, hear the SASS rules, see the equipment and accessories that are required, and get a chance to try out the range of firearms that are appropriate to the sport. A history of the sport is included in the classroom portion. You can look at the Clinic Outline to see what's covered. Atlantic Guns and the Damascus Wildlife Rangers provide all equipment and ammo, if students do not have their own yet. Each person will get the chance to shoot real cowboy hoglegs, a scatter gun and lever action rifle! You will feel the fear of that dang buzzer and learn what real brain fade is like!

The clinics are not meant to be initial firearms training. Students must already be familiar with the safe use and unassisted loading of revolvers, rifles and shotguns. If you do not have experience, you can take the classroom portion but, you can only observe the live fire portion. For additional information contact Chuckaroo IzaakWaltonWAC@aol.com . You will be required to complete a waiver that includes your experience competency in order to participate in the shooting portion. Having fired a gun sometime in your life, is not sufficient experience with firearms in order to participate in the live fire portion of the class.

Rifle/ Pistol Committee (Hans Varmer)

It appears, at least for the present, that ammo prices are coming down and availability is up. If that continues, I predict that many more of you will be on the range in 2022. You might even consider purchasing your ammo in bulk to guard against any potential future pricing and availability issues.

Whether you have much or little, it is important to store your ammunition properly so that when you do go to the range, the ammo goes BANG. Quality ammunition, stored properly, can give you years of shooting pleasure.

Here are some tips:

- ✓ Store your ammo in a climate-controlled place that seldom to never fluctuates higher or lower than a 20-degree temperature change.
- ✓ If the area where you must store ammo is humid, store it in an air-tight canister or o-ring sealed plastic container. Throw a silicon anti-humidity pack in there as well.
- ✓ Consider purchasing a dedicated dehumidifier that's powerful enough for the size of the area where the ammo is stored.
- ✓ When you buy other products that contain silicone anti-humidity packs, put those where your ammo is stored.

<u>RANGE SAFETY</u> (Chuck Crooks) (*This can't be posted enough*)

The club has had security cameras in place for about 6 years. The cameras became necessary after some property thefts and general safety concerns.

Range rules are established for a reason. They are designed to protect the safety of all members, their guests, our neighbors and our property. For these reasons, we take range violations very seriously. No matter how trivial you might think a rule is, there is a basis for safety that must be adhered to.

Recently there has been a series of range rule violations including; shooting from a holster at a non-sanctioned event, failure to display range cards for members and their guests, shooting from the hip, shooting beyond the posted hours, failure to wear safety glasses, failure to write a guests name on the sign in log, using rifle caliber firearms on the pistol ranges and having more than one firearm on the firing line at the same time.

Initial violations (handled by the rifle and pistol committee) can be a warning and/or suspension from the ranges until you retake the range safety course. Serious violations may be reviewed by the board of directors for disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal from the club.

As you know, firearm ranges are always on the radar, especially in our area. Therefore we take our rules and the safety of our members and guests a priority.

As range officers, you are asked to report known violations to the rifle and pistol chairman.
