

What about Hunter Ed classes?

Club members will note there are Hunter Ed (HE) courses listed in the club calendar during the months of September, October and November. These dates are place-holders that are put in the club calendar more than a year in advance. That is too soon to register the courses with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR). DNR is the state agency responsible for managing all Hunter Ed courses. When a club registers a course with DNR, it is posted publicly on the DNR web-site and registration then opened to the public. In a normal year (i.e. pre-COVID) our courses would be registered with DNR sometime during the month of June. Students could then pre-register for our courses.

However, due to COVID, we found it necessary to delay registration of our courses until after the first week in September. This is to accommodate the latest COVID mitigation protocols required by the State of Maryland and DNR. The protocols of the past two years forced the teaching team here at the club to revise the type of course we offer and also its format. This meant we did NOT offer the traditional in-classroom course. Instead, we were only able to offer the internet-based Hunter Ed course Field Day. Additionally, we also chose avoid any indoor group activity for the class and consequently held the entire Field Day class outdoors at the covered ranges. Normally we would have used the main meeting hall in the clubhouse and also

the various ranges. Use of only outdoor facilities also meant we had to substantially limit enrollment due to space limitations in case of inclement weather.

At PRESENT we have place-holders on the club calendar for two traditional HE courses and one internet-based HE course field day. However, depending on the constantly evolving pandemic situation, we MAY have to fall back to only offering the internet-based HE course Field Day. These Field Day classes are always held on the respective Saturday or Sunday class dates presently listed on the club calendar.

If a member is interested in taking a Hunter Ed course here at the club, you should expect to see our course offerings appear on the DNR web-site sometime during first full week in September. In the event we will only offer the Field Day class portion of the internet-based course, we will be adhering to the currently listed Saturday or Sunday dates for the presently listed classes.

We are currently in search of someone to take over the Save our Streams activity at the Chapter. Our current chair has not been responsive. If interested please contact Jim Piateski Use hotlink above. Thank you!

DIFTA Match Report Saturday, May 21, 2022 (Mark Mayer)

The MD Airgun Field Target state championship was interrupted by a heat advisory for Damascus telling people to stay indoors! But FT shooters are a tough bunch, and we soldiered on; it was not that bad, starting in the high 70s, about 88 when the match ended, and low 90s for the BBQ.

Sixteen shooters competed in the 60-shot match, with one off hand and one kneeling lane, using the new course layout at DIFTA. Wind was almost completely absent, and despite a fresh tree canopy, target visibility was very good. There were 10 targets at 40 yards or longer; seven targets in the expert category, above 40 T; and six 0.5 or 3/8" targets.

Paolo Amadeo acted as match Director and BBQ chef extraordinaire.

Brian VanLiew in Open PCP continues his now well established record as the match leader, but dropped seven shots, confirming this was a tough course. Joel Gupta took the high score in a closely contested Hunter Division. Hector Medina put in an impressive performance to lead the WFTF division, proving that in the right hands a piston shooter can out compete PCPs. Tae Chung, shooting his first FT match, put in a very impressive score for a novice.

Frank Moscarillo started out shooting with a new March Scope but after a few shots rushed back to his car to mount his trusty SIII instead. Rumor has it that the March is for sale!

Rifle/ Pistol Committee (Hans Varmer)

Q: What is a "ghost gun?"

A privately made firearm (PMF) is often called a "ghost gun" because it is not marked with a serial number and is therefore far more difficult for law enforcement to trace if it is used to commit a crime. Individuals can make PMFs from scratch or they can buy weapon parts kits, including "buy-build-shoot" kits. "Buy-build-shoot" kits are essentially pre-manufactured, dissembled, complete firearms. The "Frame or Receiver" Final Rule updates the regulatory definitions of "firearm" and "frame or receiver," clarifying that weapon parts kits that permit someone to readily make a gun are regulated in the same way as commercially manufactured firearms.
