Conservation Committee Update

After an absence of over two years due to COVID, volunteers were recently welcomed back to our Montgomery County Parks. On April 22nd a group of eight from the WAC returned to Rachel Carson Conservation Park outside Laytonsville, MD to pick up where we left off with our conservation project there.

Wildlife Achievement has been planting trees at Rachel Carson over the years and providing care afterwards to keep them healthy. Our group cleared weeds and invasives from in and around

the cages, repaired damaged cages, and tagged a number of dead trees that will need to be removed. Having not been there the past several years, there is much more to be done. It is very satisfying to see trees we planted years ago doing so well and are ready to have their protective cages removed. We plan on continuing to plant trees here and provide the necessary maintenance to keep them healthy for the years to come.

In addition, the Conservation Committee is working with Parks to add new project sites in the coming months. Our long term project at Brookeville is complete and our other project at Pigtail on Brighton Dam in conjunction with WSSC is winding down and not requiring as much attention. Along with the Rachel Carson site we are looking to add Oak Ridge Conservation Park in Damascus. This 179 acre park is located off of Bethesda Church Road and close to our chapter. Parks acquired the initial 64 acres in 1976 and an additional 115 acres were added in 2010. Initially we are planning to assist with deer cage removal on trees that Parks has planted in the past. In addition we are planning another deer cage removal project at Hoyle's Mill Conservation Park near Boyds.

Keep an eye out for future conservation projects! After all, we are a conservation organization and it would be great to see more members come out to these events other than those that need work credit.

We are currently in search of someone to take over the Save our Streams activity at the Chapter. Our current chair has not been responsive. If interested please contact Jim Piateski

New Shooter looking for that first gun to buy? Here are four guns that should NOT be your first:

- 1 **A Tiny Gun**. Why not? Generally speaking, the smaller the gun, the harder to shoot well. A small gun will magnify your mistakes. They will be hard to control and their accuracy, beyond a few yards, will suffer. Save this one after you have a lot of experience.
- 2 **A Super Lightweight Gun**. While this may be more comfortable to carry, it also will be harder to shoot accurately. And from personal experience, the felt recoil will be downright painful. Will you shoot hundreds of rounds in practice with such a gun? Probably not.
- 3 **Any Gun You Are Afraid of**. Don't buy a gun that intimidates you. Or is a larger heavy hitting caliber. You will get there one day, but don't make it your first.
- 4 **Someone Else's Gun**. Nothing wrong with trying out a friend's favorite gun. It's a great way to get started in your search. But keep searching. Find a range that has rentals and try out the ones that interest you.

So, what should you buy? Something that you can shoot comfortably and confidently. Whatever that looks like for you is your "best" first gun.
