CHAPTER NEWS AND EVENTS

WAC CHAPTER ORIENTATION AND RANGE SAFETY CLASS IS NOW MANDATORY

There are some members that do not use the rifle, pistol or shotgun ranges. Many of these members have never attended the chapter "Orientation and Range Safety Class". Members that have not attended the Orientation and Range Safety class are not issued member range passes and cannot use these ranges on their own until they complete the class.

This causes the members using only the airgun or archery ranges to not have credentials indicating that they are members. This is a particular concern on the archery range due to its location at the main entrance to our property.

The board of directors has a long standing policy that you must display a range pass when using any of the chapter ranges. This includes Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun, Archery and Airgun ranges. Not covering the airgun and archery ranges was an oversight and needs to be corrected.

Effective January 1, 2024, all members must display a WAC range pass when using any of the above ranges. This will also limit guests to only two per qualified member. An archery and airgun component has been added to the orientation and range safety class.

A green member range pass and red Visitor pass must be displayed while on any chapter range with the exception of organized and supervised events.

The orientation and Range Safety classes are held on the last Sunday of the month at 8:30 AM. The class is approximately 3 hours long and is held in the main hall. You must pre-register by email. You can email John Randall to let him know you are coming.

Members that have not taken the range Orientation and Range Safety class must complete the

class by the end of this year. Any member that has not completed the class by January 1, 2024 cannot use any range on their own and can only use the ranges as a guest of a member that has completed the class. All members and their guests must display their range card while on any of our ranges.

PENALTY INCREASE FOR INCOMPLETE VOLUNTEER HOURS

Starting with the <u>2024</u> dues renewal process, all members that have not completed the required 4 volunteer work projects within their probationary period will be charged a \$100 penalty instead of the current \$60 penalty.

Two of the four projects must be a conservation project. All four can be conservation but a minimum of two is required. The club calendar has all conservation projects listed in Bold Green letters. Regular credit projects are written in Bold Brown letters.

The Board of Directors approved the increase in an effort to encourage members to volunteer for chapter conservation and regular work projects. We are a volunteer organization and of late, the number of volunteers has not been sufficient to complete all of the needed work activities.

As long as members have not completed their requirements, they will remain on probationary status. If you complete your projects in year one, you are still on probation until your two years are up.

Rifle/Pistol (Hans Varmer)

The 2023 Calendar is now posted on the website. For your convenience, we are including the Rifle & Pistol Committee events in one convenient place, with the online class pre-registration link for you to plan. The cost of all classes, such as NRA Basic Pistol and Wear & Carry Day 2, is \$150, Utah non-residence carry permits is \$150. Stop the Bleed classes will be \$50 and, the NEW Practical Defense Holster will be \$30.

FINAL REMINDER: The **NRA Basic Rifle Class** will be held on **Sunday, November 19**. This class will teach the basic Knowledge, Skills, and Attitude for safely owning and using a rifle.

Classroom: 8:00 am – 1:00 pm

Will be conducted at the upper level of the chapter hall.

Range Qualification: 1:00 pm- 3:00 pm

Will be conducted at the covered pistol range. Students will be individually supervised by WAC Range Safety Officers who will also provide .22 caliber rifles and ammunition.

This class is open to WAC members and their family, ages 13 and up only. Minors must be accompanied by their parent/guardian the entire time.

Field Target Clinic

The Adult Air Rifle Program held two Introduction to Field target Clinics on October 28 and November 4 at the chapter's outdoor airgun range. The clinic started with an introduction to rules of Field target shooting, and the procedures for safe loading of pre charged pneumatic rifles from air tanks with 4500 psi air, before moving on to shooting. Five chapter members took advantage of the chapters new **Diana Stormrider and Benjamin Marauder loaner rifles** to practice shooting targets, and to try out different shooting positions.

We started with a quick familiarization, shooting from a bench rest. Shown on the left is John Moulden getting advice from Hector Medina, and learning hands on how to estimate target distances, set out over a 10 to 55 yard range, using a high magnification rifle scope, and then how to adjust the aim point to compensate for differences in trajectory as a function of target

distance. Hector shoots as a member of the World Field Target Federation US team and has a lot of experience in competitions.

Next our shooters tried out the classical Field Target position, sitting on the ground, where Mark Coggeshall shown in the middle, displayed excellent form and marksmanship learned from his father who was an expert rifleman. Shown on the right is Phil Raum, practicing shooting for Hunter Division for which shooters sit on a bucket and use a bipod to support the rifle.



All of the clinic attendees expressed their thanks for the opportunity to learn about field target and expressed high enthusiasm for the course. Most of the participants had never shot a modern air rifle before and were surprised at the high accuracy of these guns. A common refrain was how difficult some of the small targets were to hit, with for example a 3/8" kill zone set out at a distance of 15 yards that is a challenge even to expert shooters. Fortunately, in Field Target matches the targets cover a range of difficulty, and a 1" target at 20 yards, or a 2" target at 41 yards are much easier, and even novice Field Target shooters will score points on these.

We plan to hold the clinics again in 2024 and encourage IWLAWAC members who would like to learn about this sport come and try it out. We have three loaner rifles available both for the clinics, and for anyone who would like to shoot in a Match, sponsored by DIFTA, which are held once per month from March-November.

These loaner rifles are also available for use on the Monday evening 10 meter Adult Airgun Indoor meeting in the Rathskeller that runs from Labor Day to Memorial day where shooters can improve their off hand shooting skills for fixed position lanes in Field Target matches.
