Conservation (Calendar)

Gardens Maintenance. Meo Curtis. email meosotis58@verizon.net

When you visit the Chapter, you may have noticed areas with flowering plants and trees-.across from the green maintenance shed, around the Chapter House, and nearby. These areas were planted over many years to add color and variety to our landscape and also to provide food for adult and young pollinators. 'Pollinators' are any creatures that visit flowers and carry the pollen from one plant to another to create more plants! Folks know about the introduced honeybee as an important pollinator for crops and for the terrific honey made from the nectar of those flowers. There are many other pollinators including native bees, wasps, flies, butterflies and moths, birds, and even bats. These are important in keeping the biodiversity of our natural areas.

It turns out that native bumblebees are better pollinators than honeybees for certain crops (e.g. strawberries and greenhouse grown vegetables)

https://nwdistrict.ifas.ufl.edu/phag/2022/02/25/the-pollinating-power-of-bumble-bees/. And although they are much larger and more noisy than honeybees, these flying teddy bears very rarely sting. In fact, you can pet a bumblebee (ask Jeff Deschamps).

At the Chapter, we've had monthly gardens maintenance as a separate work day for many years—directly in response to member requests to have weekday as well as weekend work days. The separate work day assures routine attention for keeping down the weeds and overgrowing vines, keeping the growth trimmed back as needed, and mulching for moisture retention. The first gardens maintenance day is scheduled for <u>Friday March 15</u>. This early in the season, the work will be trimming back dead top growth and pulling out early weeds and vines. As the season progresses, there will be thinning, transplanting, and mulching. There may even be opportunities to take home a plant or two from the thinning process.

If you'd like to learn more about our Chapter gardens and are interested in helping to design and oversee some garden changes this year, volunteer at one of our monthly work days. I'd love to hear your ideas and help you implement them to add even more beauty to our Chapter grounds.

<u>**Rifle/Pistol</u>** (Mindy Goldsborough, WAC Education Coordinator) **Are You Using All Of Your WAC Membership Benefits?**</u>

One of greatest benefits of your WAC membership is the ability to take instructional firearms and safety classes right on site. These classes cover a wide variety of topics including handgun safety and proficiency, how to use and select a holster, rifle safety and proficiency, personal protection inside the home, personal protection outside the home, and stop the bleed. The classes are taught to high standards by trained and certified instructors who also happen to be fellow WAC members that volunteer their time to help enhance knowledge and safety within our membership.

The Basic Pistol Class is one of WAC's most popular firearm classes and participants can qualify to obtain their HQL (handgun qualification license) which is needed to buy or transfer a handgun in MD. This class also serves as the prerequisite for members who want to go on to obtain a MD concealed carry permit.

And who doesn't want to learn how to save someone's life? The stop the bleed course can do just that.

The firearms classes have both a classroom portion and a range portion - this enable you to practice what you just learned in class on the range under the eyes of the instructors/range safety officers.

Classes are available to WAC members, family, and friends and are offered throughout the year so you can build your skills. In addition, these classes are a great value compared to costs at local ranges and all funds go directly to support WAC.
