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Rifle/ Pistol (Mindy Goldsborough)

The first session of a new firearms training class, Concealed Carry Draw From Holster 101, was given to WAC members on May 4th. With so many of our members now having their MD concealed carry license, Joe Pauley and Dean Elliott, co-chairs of the Rifle and Pistol Committee, wanted to develop additional opportunities for safety training for this group.

While drawing from a holster is not allowed on WAC ranges except at certain special events, it is a skill that concealed carry permit holders need to safely master. This course was designed to provide members with a MD concealed carry license the background knowledge and practical skills to help them improve their draw from holster skills. This course is based on advanced skills training exercises some of the RSO's (range safety officers) have taken on their own at a specialized facility.

The 101 class, which is currently available, consists of an hour of classroom time covering holster type pros and cons with many examples available for viewing and repetitive "blue gun" holster draw exercises to get everyone's basic safe draw mechanics engrained. Then we move to the range where for 2 hours participants are on the firing line, partnered with an RSO, to practice those safe draw from holster skills with their own firearms. The class starts slow, first without ammunition, then with single shots, and then multiple shots and magazine changes. Some of the final exercises include the incorporation of snap caps into the magazines to mimic a malfunction that needs to be cleared on the fly, and moving towards a target while shooting. See picture for an example of one of the drills.

A 201 class that will build upon the skills of the 101 class is in development for the 2026 WAC calendar of events.

At this first class it was great to see the participant's skill and comfort level significantly grow just within those few hours. Everyone who participated had very positive remarks on the class information and drills - they were already eager for the 201 class!

The Rifle and Pistol Committee will be offering this class 3 more times this year, on Saturday, July 12th, Sunday, July 20th, and Saturday, August 2nd. The fee for the class is \$75.00. Class size is limited to 6 participants (MD concealed carry permit required) per class. Contact wacedu@iwlwac.org to sign up.

Participants who take this class will be able to draw from a holster at the bimonthly Practical Defense Matches (see WAC calendar for schedule).

Do not underline or make any text bold or in color. Please limit the number of ads to 3 per member. We are not responsible for pricing errors or seller's content. Ads will only be listed in the online version of the newsletter since there is not a space limitation and will be listed as received (copy and pasted) without any edits.

Items must be your personal property and not for business purposes. We do not post commercial sales. Use upper and lower case letters, do not use all caps. Do not send spreadsheets or formatted columns. Please do not send the ad as a file, send it in the text of a regular Email. Do not use bold text except for the brand. Each ad should be written individually. Include your name, membership number and contact information **after each ad**. Items must be firearm or shooting sports related.

"Want ads" will need to have contact information and adhere to formatting requirements, but the content can be as general or specific as needed depending on the item that you are looking to acquire.

Deadline is by 5:00 PM on the last Monday of the month. Ads will be listed in the order received.

For additional information, please contact the seller directly.

Items that are over 6 months old will be deleted unless you send a renewal of the ad. Please advise Forrest if the item has been sold or is no longer for sale. Ads will be removed, after the date (that I populate) at the end of each ad based on the date it was added to the newsletter. All transactions are between the seller and buyer and Federal and State Laws must be followed for all firearm transfers.

MARYLAND FIREARM TRANSFERS

Handgun and now long gun transfers in Maryland require that the transfer be made by a licensed dealer or through the Maryland State Police. All firearms purchased from out of state or through the Internet must also go through a Federal Firearms dealer within your state. The FFL must be at the recipients (buyers) end, not the shipping end. It is often difficult to find a dealer that is willing to take on sales that were not originated by them. However, if you know of a dealer who is willing to assist with firearm transfers, please let me (Forrest at fpnthree@gmail.com) know

and I will add their information in this section.
